

The "O Antiphons" of Advent

The Roman Church has been singing the "O" Antiphons since at least the eighth century. They are the antiphons that accompany the *Magnificat* canticle of Evening Prayer from December 17-23. They are a magnificent theology that uses ancient biblical imagery drawn from the messianic hopes of the Old Testament to proclaim the coming Christ as the fulfillment not only of Old Testament hopes, but present ones as well. Their repeated use of the imperative "Come!" embodies the longing of all for the Divine Messiah.

December 17

O Wisdom of our God Most High, guiding creation with power and love: come to teach us the path of knowledge!

December 18

O Leader of the House of Israel, giver of the Law to Moses on Sinai: come to rescue us with your mighty power!

December 19

O Root of Jesse's stem, sign of God's love for all his people: come to save us without delay!

December 20

O Key of David, opening the gates of God's eternal Kingdom: come and free the prisoners of darkness!

December 21

O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

December 22

O King of all nations and keystone of the Church: come and save man, whom you formed from the dust!

December 23

O Emmanuel, our King and Giver of Law: come to save us, Lord our God!


REFLECTION: THE O ANTIPHONS OF ADVENT

When I'm out shopping in mid-November, and I hear the strains of "Silver Bells" and "The Little Drummer Boy" wafting from hidden store speakers, I just want to cover my ears. By the middle of December each year, I've usually had it up to here with most Christmas music. The ever-present repetition of Christmas carols often serves to point out that the rest of the world is celebrating Christmas, while we're still in the season of Advent.

For me, the one exception to this audio barrage is a simple chant for Advent, "O Come, O Come Emmanuel." This song, with it's longing for the coming of the Savior, genuinely belongs to Advent and not to Christmas. Its melody is based on Gregorian Chant, and it's verses are all taken from the Church's "O" antiphons. These antiphons introduce the Magnificat, or canticle of Mary, at evening prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours, from December 17th through December 23rd. Each of them begins with a traditional title for Christ.They are:"O Wisdom,""O sacred Lord," "O Flower of Jesse's Stem," "O Key of David," "O Radiant Dawn," "O King of all the nations," and finally, "O Emmanuel" which means "God with us." Each of these traditional titles for the Messiah connects the coming of Christ with the prophetic writings of the Old Testament.

In some Catholic parishes, the Sunday liturgies during Advent feature the tune of "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" as the setting for the Holy Holy, the Great Amen, and other sung parts of the Mass. While it's asking a lot for this simple tune to bear so much repetition for four weeks, this setting does anchor us firmly in the longing and anticipation of Advent. But the original hymn, with it's pleading for Christ's coming, still serves as a welcome antidote to the onslaught of bad commercial Christmas music that we have to endure every November and December. It also connects us to the evening prayer of the whole Church in the last week of Advent.

WALKING WITH PURPOSE WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY MOVES TO WEDNESDAY MORNINGS


Program Description





FAITH MATTERS

CHIRSTMAS POSSIBILITIES

To write this column, I begin by reading the Gospel of the weekend, seeing what word or phrase the Holy Spirit prompts me to reflect upon. But for this weekend, there are 5 different Gospels! Christmas Vigil Mass aka Christmas Eve. Mass during the Night aka Midnight Mass. Mass at Dawn aka 7:30 am Mass, Mass during the Day (9, 10:30, and noon), and the one for the Feast of Holy Family (4pm on Christmas and Sunday Masses). All of the Christmas Masses share different parts of the Christmas Story (Joseph's dream to marry Mary, the angels announcing to the shepherds, the shepherds coming to the baby, John's poetic "and the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us") and Holy Family this year is the Finding of the Child Jesus in the Temple. And reading all these, I began to ponder this question: "why do we make such a fuss about a baby born over 2000 years ago?"! In other words, before age 33 when he began his public ministry of miracles and teaching, Jesus was a baby, anonymous. Some shepherds made a fuss. A trio of astrologers came to visit. Mary kept it all in her heart (Luke 2:19). Why do we need to print more than double our usual bulletins for these Masses? What's so special about this particular little infant? Why does he inspire such devotion, such attention, such hope? What's your answer? Mine came during a recent Family Faith Formation session in which families were working together to do activities that taught them about their faith. But one dad was on his own with 3 boys, one of which was a toddler 2-year old who only wanted to run around, keeping his dad from working with his elder boys. I offered to take the child with me on an errand across the parking lot to retrieve a book from my office. The child agreed, leaning into my arms, and letting me carry him to and from my office. As I looked into his beautiful face, full of innocence and wonder, I was once again taken by the fact that children, by their nature alone, can cause such hope and joy to well within us because of their own childish nature. In them we see so much potential. And by knowing the end of Jesus' story (spoiler alert: he triumphs over death after being crucified), knowing that he perfectly fulfilled his potential to become the Savior of the World, the beginning of His story resonates with that ending, at which we can imagine the beautiful face of the baby Jesus and feel the hope and joy we know can be fulfilled because of Him. Christmas is a time to consider possibilities, potentiality. What might come into your life in 2022? What hope, wish, dream, aspiration, or goal might come to fruition? What beautiful possibility might be born and do some growing in your life?




