

In celebrating the beauty and simplicity of the Epiphany, we see in tangible ways God's creative, redemptive, and restorative power. This refreshment and revitalization is offered not only to a select few but to everyone throughout the world. There is nothing routine or static about God. Surprises, wonders, miracles, opportunities, healings, and joy without measure are available to those who believe. There are never any endings, just beginnings. And, when darkness, boredom, and gloom seem to be the order of the day, a bright new light now shines pointing us to truth and reminding us that we are loved.



Saint of the Week

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint."





HEROD'S LESSON

My family is in a state of transition. I only have one child in elementary school, one in middle school, and two (!) in high school. My eldest now has a part time job in the evenings-combined with mine and my wife's work schedules requiring evening hours, family dinner with all six of us is vanishingly rare. And moreover, having two teenagers, they spend the majority of their time in their own rooms on their own devices and need to be reminded that they, in fact, still have parents! This Christmas season I found myself yearning for years past when the presents required more snap together assembly and less signing into accounts and configuring settings. The scariest part of this transition, however, has to be the fact that I find parenting teens requires a whole different set of skills and expectations. While I can still order them to do things or demand obedience, if I want my words, my advice, my experience to have real lasting impact on their decisions that make them who they are, I need to relate to them as the independent young people they are becoming, not the children I remember tearing into presents under the tree! And that's threatening since it feels like a loss of power. I have all this good I want to share with my kids. When they're little I can just tell them and expect them to listen to me. Dad's authority reigned. As they've gotten older, the authority of friends and popular culture has risen in their lives. Suddenly I can relate to King Herod, in today's Gospel, more than I ever have before; he heard about a child who was to be king and feared for his power. Just as Herod feared that he would be supplanted. I miss the days when my kids came to me with questions and listened attentively to what I had to say! Have you ever felt your power threatened? Experienced a sudden change in your influence? Perhaps a new co-worker arrives on the scene and steals your thunder. Perhaps an equal to you gets a promotion over you. Or someone new befriends your friend. Maybe a spouse or girlfriend wants to change the dynamic between you. How do you react? In my case, I could yell more, demand more, try to hold on and exert that old authority over my teens since they're still my children. Herod certainly went this route, going even so far as to try and eliminate his rival. But the three wise men provide a different model; they welcomed the infant king, generously shared gifts, and refused to collude with Herod's insecurity, listening instead to God. Can we likewise be generous, courageous, and faithful to God when our authority is challenged? Can we 'be not afraid' in the face of change and perhaps find an epiphany of our own that new can be good or even better? Let's try!
