

HOW GOOD IS TO START 2022 IN THE PRESENCE OF GOD





WALKING WITH PURPOSE WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY MOVES TO WEDNESDAY MORNINGS


Program Description

RISKING DISAPPOINTMENT

Happy (secular calendar) New Year! Due to early publisher deadlines this is the first column I'm writing in 2022, still early enough that all those 2's look weird and definitely feel weird to write! The beginning of a year naturally prompts consideration of goals, dreams, and hopes for what's to come (hopefully better than has come before!). I'm reading a book (a Christmas present to myself) titled Atlas of the Heart by Brené Brown. It seeks to articulate a comprehensive vocabulary of emotion and experiences from the premise that having language to describe what we feel helps us better relate to what we feel. I recently read the section titled "Places We God When Things Don't Go As Planned: Boredom, Disappointment, Expectations, Regret, Discouragement, Resignation, Frustration." Sounds cheery, right?! But what most caught my attention was this quote: "There are too many people in the world today who decide to live disappointed rather than risk feeling disappointment." (page 51). The book defines disappointment as unmet expectations (page 42). And many decide to lower expectations rather than risk greater disappointment. Can you relate? Ever think to yourself, 'well, if I don't get my hopes up and things go well then I can be surprised instead of setting myself up.' I think most of us have done that at least sometimes. But the quote points to the tragedy of doing it all the time, since as humans we're wired for hope, created to yearn for an eternity of joy (aka heaven). Jesus reminds us "I came that you might have life, and have it more abundantly." (John 10:10). Today's Gospel begins, "The people were filled with expectation," asking in their hearts if John was their savior, their Messiah. Do you have the courage to risk disappointment by being 'filled with expectation' this new year? Have you spent any time dreaming? Imagining how things could be different, could be better? I'm certainly trying to do so. I wrote a few weeks back about the fact that I'm in a midlife kind of place, transitioning out of having little kids and into having adolescents and soon to be young adults. I continue to wrestle with the question: what are my goals, dreams, hopes, expectations for this next part of my life? My wife and I are having conversations like "what can we realistically (read: financially afford) to accomplish this year, in the next three years, in the next five?" Visions of painting walls, replacing carpet, paying off credit card debt, taking trips dance through these conversations. God calls us to be a people of expectations, of hope, of dreams. What's ahead for you in this new year? Had any good dreams lately?
