

#### Financial Review for St. Andrew Parish

January 2022

Dear Parishioners,

As we begin a new year, it is important to embrace all of the wonderful blessings that have come our way in 2021 for St. Andrew Parish and St. Andrew Catholic School. We look forward to what our goals will be for 2022. As part of this reflection, I would like to present to you our Annual Financial Statement for fiscal year ending June 2021 for both our Parish and School.

Through the generosity of many parishioners, we replaced our 40-year-old pews, updated many of our older air conditioning units, centrally located Outdoor Stations of the Cross on the southeast lawn of the church. Coming in 2022, we will be adding a paver walkway around the Outdoor Stations of the Cross and re-sealing the skylight above the altar as it is causing leaks in the ceiling.

Our school has seen tremendous growth over the last school year. We ended our 2020-2021 school year with 354 students and in August of 2021 we opened with 423 students. The school continues to provide a highquality educational program to currently 437 students. This past summer a beautiful new Math Lab and Robotics Lab were added. Our Parish provided over \$153,000 in support and tuition financial assistance to our School; this was in addition to our direct Parishioner support of \$36,000 through your "Blue Envelope" donations. Please refer to our weekly bulletins throughout the school year for "Highlights" of activities and accomplishments.

Our CFA goal for 2021 was \$305,000. As of January 7, 2022, I am proud to announce we have met our goal!! A very "Big Thank You" to all who so generously support our parish. The CFA remains a critical part of how our 61 Parishes deliver support to our area. As we prepare to start the 2022 CFA campaign, I will pray that we are able to meet this assessment early so that we can concentrate on the needs of our Parish.

As each of us individually consider our stewardship, we are reminded of returning to GOD what He has so generously given to us. The church is not just a building, it's the wonderful people in our community. And as a family we must share in its care. Thank you so much for all that you do.

Please know that I, along with my brother priests, always keep you in our prayers. Without each and every one of you actively participating in the life of our Parish, our ministries would be very limited. Together, as a parish family, we will continue to build St. Andrew Parish and make it all it can be.





Con la fiesta de la Epifanía y el Bautismo del Señor se cierra el Tiempo de Navidad, que siempre es precedido por el Adviento. Ahora, comenzamos el Tiempo Ordinario. Serán siete domingos de este corto periodo, que termina el día anterior al Miércoles de Ceniza. La segunda etapa de este Tiempo es más larga, da comienzo después del domingo de Pentecostés y termina hasta el sábado antes del primer domingo de Adviento. ¿Para qué sirve a los cristianos este Tiempo Ordinario? ¿Qué nos pide la Liturgia de este tiempo? Pues, es muy sencillo, nos pide meditar en el misterio de Cristo. En su invitación de participar en su Reino con alegría y compromiso verdadero. La

Iglesia tiene diversidad de carismas, donde podemos entregarnos al servicio de los demás.

Por ejemplo, hoy el Evangelio nos invita a participar junto con María y Jesús en las bodas de Caná. Y es ahí en esa boda, donde Jesús hace su primer milagro a petición de su Madre María. El diálogo de ambos viene a ser a causa de la falta de

vino. Por lo tanto, los novios estaban en apuros por esta razón. Este relato es muy profundo, el hecho de que Jesús participa en la boda, tiene como significado la boda de Dios con la humanidad, que más adelante será la Sangre de Jesús derramada para la salvación de la humanidad. "Alegrémonos, regocijémonos démosle honor y gloria, porque han llegado las bodas del Cordero" (Apocalipsis 19,7). También, el profeta en la primera lectura lo pone claro: "No te llamaran más 'Abandonada', ni a tu tierra 'Desolada', sino que te llamaran 'Mi Preferida' y a tu tierra tendrá un esposo" (Isaías 62,4).



#### **ENCOURAGED TO COURAGE**

I love how normal and human the interaction between Mary and Jesus is in today's Gospel story. When Mary asks Jesus to do something about the lack of wine, he responds rather brusquely: "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." (John 2:4). Can't you just see Mary raising one evebrow at that reply?! How often have I had similar conversations with my own children in which they didn't want to do something, but because I knew it was the right thing to do, I pushed them to do it anyway. We encourage our children to go beyond themselves, to step outside their comfort zone, to grow and stretch to discover who they can be. I can only imagine how Mary felt seeing Jesus perform his first public miracle. I know how I feel when I see my children fulfill their potential, do something they've never done, something beautiful or exciting or just quietly brave. It inspires me to do the same. How often do we listen to Mary's call to help others, to remember the importance of stepping outside ourselves and our own comfort zone to be the person God calls us to be? Let's remember this week.
