

FEAST OF ST. BLAISE—BLESSING OF THROATS

THURSDAY, February 3 is the Feast of St. Blaise. In the memory of St. Blaise, the Blessing of Throats will take place at the 7:30am and 9:00am Masses. It was the recommendation of the Liturgy Committee, and approved by Fr. Eduardo, that the Blessing of Throats would not be an individual blessing of throats, rather, follow the optional formula offered in the ORDO:

"If, for pastoral reasons, each individual cannot be blessed in the usual manner, a priest or deacon may give the blessing to all by extending his hands, without crossed candles, over the people while saying the prayer of blessing . . . During the Mass, the blessing follows the homily and general intercessions. "

(Order of Prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours and Celebration of the Eucharist 2022)

CANDLEMAS DAY CANDLE BLESSING

Feb 2, is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, also known as Candlemas Day. On this feast we celebrate Mary and Joseph bringing Jesus to the Temple to consecrate him to the Lord per Jewish law. There they met the righteous man Simeon who in the Gospel of Luke declares Jesus "a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel." This sparked the tradition to bless enough candles to last an entire year and to candle processions in churches and in the streets. We will celebrate this tradition too by inviting parishioners to bring candles to Mass this day to be blessed after Mass.


MEN'S BREAKFAST

STATEMENT ON ROE V. WADE DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE LEGAL PROTECTION OF UNBORN LIFE January 22, 2022

On this tragic 49th anniversary of the U.S. Supreme Court's decision in *Roe v. Wade* that legalized abortion and stripped the unborn of their fundamental right to life, we mourn the heartbreaking loss of over 62 million victims. The Catholic Church stands emphatically and unreservedly for the rights of the unborn. We look forward with the hope that God will soon bring our nation to a profound awareness of the dignity of human life and a recognition that all lives deserve protection under the law.

We are especially encouraged that the U.S. Supreme Court has heard arguments in the Mississippi abortion case, *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*. This case addresses whether banning abortions after 15 weeks gestation is constitutional. Although difficult to predict, this could very well be the case that overturns *Roe* entirely or in part. We are steadfast in praying that there will be a monumental shift in the Court's abortion precedent in favor of protecting unborn children. We entreat the faithful to commit to daily prayer and fasting along with other believers across the country for a decision that honors the sanctity of unborn life through the Pray for Dobbs campaign (www.prayfordobbs.com).

We also remain hopeful that the Florida Supreme Court will have an opportunity to reconsider its 1989 ruling that interpreted our state constitution's privacy clause to find a right to abortion in Florida. We are closely following a case currently on appeal, *Gainesville Woman Care*, *LLC v. State of Florida*, addressing the constitutionality of a common-sense Florida law requiring a 24-hour reflection period prior to abortion. Though this good law is being challenged on the basis that it violates the state constitutional right to privacy, we pray for a judicial outcome that upholds the pro-life law so that women have more time to deliberate undergoing an abortion. Additionally, we urge Florida's Agency for Healthcare Administration to strengthen enforcement of existing abortion regulations.

As a Church, we are committed to accompanying all women, including those experiencing unplanned pregnancies or considering abortion. One way that we have been serving pregnant women and their families is through the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' initiative *Walking with Moms in Need*, which connects parishioners with volunteer opportunities at community pregnancy resource centers. We wholeheartedly support this ministry that offers tangible, life-affirming support for vulnerable families – fathers, mothers and their babies. As Pope Francis has said, "And among the most fragile are children who do not see the light because their mothers suffer economic, social and cultural conditioning that drives them to give up that wonderful gift that is the birth of a child." (Address of His Holiness Pope Francis to the Hospital of the Innocents Institute, May 2019)

The Church seeks to be a beacon in a dark world and desires to serve as a field hospital to all who are contemplating or have been harmed by abortion. Even while we recommit to highlighting the great good in embracing life so that abortion is unthinkable, may the Lord continually renew our collective passion to advocate for the protection of unborn children from harm. We ask that the Lord would guide and strengthen our elected and appointed officials in Florida and pray that the legislative and judicial branches at both the state and federal levels come to respect the sacredness of each human life, including the unborn. Let us continue to fight for a culture of life in all spheres so that our society may appreciate the truth that every person—no matter their size, ability, or location—is worthy and worth protecting.





CONFERENCIA DE OBISPOS CATOLICOS DE LA FLORIDA

DECLARACIÓN SOBRE ROE V. WADE JORNADA DE ORACIÓN POR LA PROTECCIÓN LEGAL DE LA VIDA POR NACER 22 de enero de 2022

En este trágico 49º aniversario de la decisión del Tribunal Supremo de los Estados Unidos en el caso de Roe vs. Wade, que legalizó el aborto y despojó a los no nacidos de su derecho fundamental a la vida, lamentamos la desgarradora pérdida de más de 62 millones de víctimas. La Iglesia Católica defiende enfáticamente y sin reservas los derechos de los no nacidos. Tenemos la esperanza de que Dios pronto llevará a nuestra nación a una profunda concienciación sobre la dignidad de la vida humana y a reconocer que todas las vidas merecen la protección de la ley.

En especial, nos anima que el Tribunal Supremo de los Estados Unidos haya escuchado los argumentos en el caso de Mississippi sobre el aborto, Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization. Este caso examina si la prohibición de los abortos después de las 15 semanas de gestación es constitucional. Aunque es difícil de predecir, este bien pudiera ser el caso que anule Roe en su totalidad o en parte. Oramos con vehemencia para que, en la jurisprudencia del Tribunal sobre el aborto, se produzca un cambio monumental a favor de la protección de los niños no nacidos. Pedimos a los fieles que, unidos a otros creyentes de todo el país, se comprometan con la oración y el ayuno diarios a través de la campaña Pray for Dobbs (www.prayfordobbs.com), por una decisión que honre la santidad de la vida por nacer.

También tenemos esperanza de que el Tribunal Supremo de Florida tenga la oportunidad de reconsiderar su fallo de 1989 que interpretó la cláusula de privacidad de nuestra constitución estatal para reconocer el derecho al aborto en Florida. Seguimos con mucha atención un caso que en estos momentos se encuentra en apelación, Gainesville Woman Care, LLC v. State of Florida, que aborda la constitucionalidad de una ley de Florida que requiere un período de reflexión de 24 horas antes del aborto. Aunque esta ley acertada está siendo impugnada sobre la base de que viola el derecho constitucional estatal a la privacidad, oramos por un fallo judicial que defienda la ley provida para que las mujeres tengan más tiempo para deliberar si se someten a un aborto. También exhortamos a la Agencia para la Administración de Servicios de Salud de la Florida a que adopte un método más firme para hacer cumplir la reglamentación actual sobre el

Como Iglesia, nos comprometemos con apoyar a todas las mujeres, incluidas las que experimentan embarazos no planificados o consideran el aborto. Una de las maneras en que estamos apoyando a las mujeres embarazadas y a sus familias es a través de la iniciativa "Caminando con las Madres Necesitadas", de la Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos, que conecta a los feligreses con oportunidades de voluntariado en centros comunitarios de recursos para el embarazo. Respaldamos de todo corazón este ministerio que ofrece a las familias vulnerables --padres, madres y sus bebés— un apoyo tangible y que reafirma la vida. Como ha manifest4ado el Papa Francisco: "...entre las personas más frágiles que tenemos que cuidar, ciertamente hay muchos niños rechazados, privados de su infancia y de su futuro; menores que se enfrentan a viajes desesperados para escapar del hambre o la guerra. Niños que no ven la luz porque sus madres sufren condicionamientos económicos, sociales, culturales que los empujan a renunciar a ese maravilloso regalo que es el nacimiento de un niño". (Discurso de Su Santidad el Papa Francisco al Instituto de los Inocentes, mayo de 2019)

La Iglesia busca ser una luz en un mundo a oscuras, y desea servir como un hospital de campaña para quienes contemplan o se han perjudicado por el aborto. Aun cuando nos comprometemos de nuevo con resaltar el enorme bien de acoger la vida para que el aborto sea inimaginable, que el Señor renueve continuamente nuestra pasión colectiva para abogar por el propósito de proteger de cualquier daño a los niños no nacidos. Pedimos que el Señor guíe y fortalezca a nuestros funcionarios electos y designados en Florida, y oramos para que los poderes legislativo y judicial, tanto a nivel estatal como federal, lleguen a respetar el carácter sagrado de cada vida humana, incluida la que no ha nacido. Contínuemos la lucha por una cultura de la vida en todos los ámbitos para que nuestra sociedad pueda apreciar la verdad de que toda persona —sin importar su tamaño, capacidad o procedencia— es digna y merece ser protegida.

FULFILLING PROPHECY STILL

Over 20 years ago I entered the seminary to study to become a priest (for the diocese of Memphis in TN). At the time I had hoped that I'd find happiness in being a priest, that it was my vocation, my call from God that would fix what was wrong. You see, at that time in my life, I was so poor. Not financially, spiritually. I had no prayer life. My connection with God was tenuous. I was a captive, of my arrogance, my perfectionism, really my fear. I was blind to my true giftedness, instead holding up achievement as my worth and value. Low self-esteem and unhealthy coping mechanisms (primarily impacting my diet) oppressed me. I so badly needed glad tidings, liberty, sight, and freedom. In today's Gospel Jesus reads from the prophet Isaiah:

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord.

And afterwards, "the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him. He said to them, 'Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." (Luke 4:18-21) It was certainly fulfilled in my life! Through my experiences in seminary—developing a prayer life, going to therapy, attending a life-changing silent retreat, and ultimately experiencing the love of God in a profound way that changed my identity-Jesus fulfilled that prophecy for me. My spiritual poverty became a rich legacy that I pass on to this day. I found liberation accepting my true worth as a beloved child of God. I saw that God had plans for me outside priesthood. I hope my witness to Jesus' transforming power in my life means something to you. Notice that our Gospel today begins with the author, Luke, addressing it to a reader with reassurances that he can believe what he reads (appealing to eyewitnesses and investigations). This introduction reminds us that this account is historical, that Jesus was real, and that what he said can be believed. What poverty do you suffer? What oppresses you? To what are you blind? Listen to the words of Jesus and be reassured of their reality: he fulfills prophecy. He saves, if you allow him.


