Dear Parishioners

The praise of love in the second reading is a I favorite reading that many young people choose for their wedding ceremony. It presents a magnificent ideal of married life. Unfortunately, many of them forget it. A growing number of those marriages end in divorce.

God calls us all to greatness – to the greatness of loving as God loves. Love is the greatest of the gifts that Paul writes about today. He calls this gift a way." Love is a way of life to which we are all called.

We all have certain talents and gifts. But the talents have to be developed, oftentimes by very hard work and practice. Talents can be buried, and that is tragic, for then the entire family and parish suffers, to say nothing of the one who buries them.

Flannery O'Connor was one of America's finest modern writers. She learned from the French philosopher Jacques Maritain how to develop what he called "the habit of art," habit not being a mechanical routine," but an attitude or quality of mind that is as essential as talent. Her habit of art drove her to exploit the potential of language and characterization, which eventually helped her become a very talented writer.

She also acquired and developed the habit of being, an attitude or quality of interior disposition. What came out of her habit of being is a self-portrait of a deeply religious, very intelligent, humorous, humane, and genuine person. She lived and acted out of the fullness of her Christian being.

> We can't all be writers as she was. But God has called each of us to be a lover. God has given us the talent, the power to love. If we bury that talent, fail

to develop it by hard work and sacrifice in our daily contacts with others, we doom ourselves to a life of bitterness, frustration, and joylessness for ourselves and for our families, parishes, and communities. Nazareth failed to take its son Jesus to its heart. Nazareth rejected love, as so Jesus left his hometown to itself.

Today, St. Paul spells out the characteristics of a way of life formed by love. We can consider the list as a personal examination of conscience, one that examines our relationships with God and with our neighbors. Paul says that true love is kind, patient, not jealous, does not put on airs, is not snobbish, is never rude, is not prone to anger, does not brood over injuries, is never self-seeking, always trusts, always hopes, always endures whatever comes.

An author wrote a book which he entitled Looking Out For Number One. His wife read it and divorced him. Looking out for number one is what love is not. There is only one Christian habit of being – the way of love. To follow that way, we always come back to the love that Jesus has for us. The conviction of our having been known and called and chosen because God has us from all eternity is the foundation of the habit of being we call "Christian."

God doesn't just love humanity as a whole. God loves each one of us personally. God loves us as we are, even with all our faults, our weaknesses. All God asks of us is that we believe in his love. open ourselves to it, and allow God to love in and through us. Here is a prayer God really wants to answer:

Lord our God, help us to love you with all our hearts and to love all people as you love them.





















Reflections on the First and Second Readings

Before I formed you in the womb

before you were born

I dedicated you,

I knew you,



God's Gifts Jeremiah 1:4–5, 17–29

When you discover what you are good at, you cannot let go. You may have a gift for parenting, teaching, listening, or playing a hand of bridge. Or golf. Once in a while we find out something else about the gifts God gave us. We may not know why we have

them, but events may call us to use our gifts in a way that reveals God's will.

You may have given advice that somebody needed. You may have helped a child overcome an obstacle. You may have lifted someone's spirits. You may have saved someone's life. You did all this because you had a gift, and when the moment arrived, you used the gift God gave you.

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you." God's words to Jeremiah ring deep within our souls. Think about this: God knew you before you were born. God had you in mind before you were conceived. God designed gifts

for you from the very beginning. God had a plan.

We are born without knowledge of God's plan. We are not sure how we fit. We may never know. God may be using us in ways beyond our awareness. The gifts we have are not ours. They belong to God.

When we use God's gifts, they bring us satisfaction. We cannot let go of what God meant us to be and do. God knows us better than we know ourselves.

The Challenge of Love Corinthians 12:31–13:3

One of the most popular readings at weddings is this passage from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians: "Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous. It bears all things. Love never fails." It is a beautiful hymn to love, and it captures the emotions that many couples feel as they celebrate
their wedding day.

But Paul did not have marriage in mind. He was writing about the early Christian community in Corinth, the equivalent of a parish today. The members had many gifts. They were not using them well. They were divided in their sentiments. They gold they timents. They said they believed in Jesus, but they were not acting the way he taught. Jesus wanted everyone to love God and to love their neighbor. That was not happening in Corinth.

So Paul reminded them what love is — and what it is not. "It is not jealous, it is not

pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing." The Corinthians were guilty of all these things.

Paul would probably be surprised to know that this passage is used so often at weddings today. He would probably remark, "OK—but just remember. If this describes the love of a newly married couple, that is the kind of love you should have for everyone in your parish. Not just for one person."
