#### Advent and Christmas Season

As a way of celebrating Epiphany and the New Year, gather family at the main entrance to your home and ask God's blessing on your dwelling and on all who live or visit there. The traditional blessing uses a piece of chalk to mark the following inscription at the top of the main doorway: 20 + C + M + B + 22.

The "20" is the beginning two numbers of the new year, the four + symbolize crosses which are a sign of blessing, the three letters, "C," "M," and "B" stand for the Magi Caspar, Melchoir, and Balthasar, or the three Latin words, "Christus Mansionem Benedicat," which means, "May Christ bless this home," and the "22" stands for the last two numbers of the calendar year. Once the doorway is marked, pray a prayer of blessing together.

Lord God of heaven and earth, You revealed Your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this home and all who live here. Fill us with the light of Christ that our love for one another and our concern for all others may reflect Your love. And at last receive me into the dwelling place you have prepared for me in your Father's house, where you live forever and ever. Amen.
