### Sunday Reflection With Fr. Rafal

Dear St. Joseph Parishioners and Visitors,

The Readings for the **19th Week in Ordinary Time** offer some thoughts on this Sunday's theme: Be Prepared. Be prepared not only for Joyful moments but even for Martyrdom.

Pope Francis has often reflected on martyrdom. He said this regarding the Central American martyr, Archbishop Oscar Romero: "Each Christian ought to be ready to give his life for the faith. A martyr is not born. It's a grace that the Lord allows, and that in a way concerns every baptized person." Quoting a phrase of Blessed Oscar Romero, the Pope said that "We must be willing to die for our faith, even if the Lord does not give us this honor."

"To give one's life doesn't only consist of being killed," he said, but rather "to give one's life, to have the spirit of a martyrdom, is to surrender it in duty, in silence, in prayer, in the fulfillment of duty; in this silence of everyday life; to give one's life little by little."

Jesus tells us, "Be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." In saying this Jesus is giving us advanced warning. Before considering the warning, we should note that the saying is very hopeful. No matter what we have done, no what condition we are in right now, we can still make a new beginning. We can at least get started, ask God's help to put things in order. Jesus tells us that the important thing is what we are doing the moment he returns.

In the Hail Mary, we ask Our Blessed Mother to pray for us now and at the hour of our death. Those are the two moments that matter. Yesterday is gone; tomorrow may never come. Today is what matters. How small our arguments and our battles will be when Jesus comes for us! So, ask God's help to put aside those quarrels.

Some people say that if we focus on the afterlife – heaven, purgatory or hell - we neglect this world. But, perhaps surprisingly, it's just the opposite. People who focus on eternity are often the ones who do the most in this world. Think about St. Mother Teresa. Who has done more than her to help the outcast?

St. Mother Teresa illustrates that those who focus on receiving Jesus will do good for people here on earth. The paradox applies not only to individuals, but to institutions. The institutions that we most value - for example, hospitals and universities - they were founded (back in the Middle Ages) by people with deep Christian faith.

Like Jesus, Pope Francis tells to be prepared, be prepared for martyrdom, be ready to surrender all to Jesus. "Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival."

PS, As I pray for you every day, please remember me in your prayers while I am gone for nine (9) weeks at Military bootcamp!!

# **CPR and AED TRAINING**

Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillator (AED) familiarization training was held at our Parish Center Saturday, June 18, 2022. These important skills might help to save a person's life in the event their heart stops beating, and they suffer cardiac arrest. Our instructor was Larry Linder, a Paramedic and Paramedic instructor at a local community college. Larry is also a St. Joseph parishioner and serves as an emergency medical resource to ushers at the Masses he attends. During the familiarization, training participants were introduced to topics such as;

- How do you know if someone needs CPR?
- What do you do before performing CPR (i.e. call 911 etc.)?
- How do you perform CPR using only chest compressions (no mouth to mouth)?
- If an AED is available, when and how do I use the device?

• Am I liable for trying to help someone by using CPR (in a word, no)?

Our thanks go out to Larry Linder for sharing his knowledge and expertise with our parishioners and community members. #### **CAUGHT IN THE RISING ACTION**

Think of some of your favorite iconic movies. I'm not talking about the feel-good comedies or the offbeat coming-of-age flicks. I'm talking about the movies that you found had a profound impact on you or made you go "Hmmm."

I'm willing to bet that the plot of this film features some tough moments and difficult scenarios. However happy the ending, at some point, the situation for the protagonist might look awfully hopeless. The script speaks some truth to you about what it is to be human in difficult circumstances. What it means to persevere.

We're attracted to the tension that exists when the hero is besieged. We're captivated by the decisions he makes in the darkest hour of the night when it seems like the dawn will never come. Why? Because we know that feeling so well. This is the essence of our human life on earth: waiting, hoping, doubting — and enduring.

We know the ending to our story, but we don't know when it's coming. We live our whole lives in the rising action of the narrative. Sure, it gets old. Tiresome, even dull. We may start to despair that the climactic scene is coming at all.


But faith is the realization of things hoped for, and evidence of things not seen. We feel it watching a great movie, because we recognize it intuitively: it is faith which earns the happy ending. No one is drawn to the story when the hero gives up or gets tired of waiting for the payoff. Everyday stewardship is the collection of choices we make while we're waiting, because we are called to action, not idleness, even in our perpetual state of expectation.





# SCAM Alert

Please be careful when responding to requests for financial help from Diocesan/ Parish priests and staff.

Some parishioners have received text/ email messages from people pretending to be clergy, requesting donations in the form of gift cards and/or wire transfers. These

messages often come from text/emails that look similar to official Diocesan/Parish numbers or accounts and often greet the recipient by name and have the priest's, Bishop's, or staff member's name in the from line and/or closing signature of the message. It is Diocesan policy that neither the Bishop, nor priests or staff may request donations in the form of gift cards, PayPal, MoneyGram, etc. It has been common that the email addresses used have been nearly identical to the actual Diocesan/parish email, but instead of being a .ORG email, it is from a gmail.com, yahoo.com or other common email service provider.

There is already an established process in place as to how parishioners can make donations and participate in the life of the Parish. Whenever a parishioner is worried about any request for money from the Parish or a priest, they should immediately call the Parish Office and under no circumstances should they respond to these scam requests.


