



SECOND SCRUTINY

We cannot travel into the darkness without a source of light. Those going through the Second Scrutiny have come seeking light instead of darkness. When Jesus heals the blind man, he not only gives to him a physical sight that is real, but he also provides for him a new spiritual lens through which he can see the world. Those who witness the healing, those who then encounter the man, and even those who maintain a cynicism toward him, all have been offered this new way of seeing the world. Those of us who have been baptized have this gift of new sight, but too often we either choose to put on glasses of sin or despair or act like we cannot see that which exists clearly in front of us. We pray for those who will be baptized at Easter to be freed from their darkness, while we oftentimes choose to live with our eyes closed. As we listen to the words of Jesus in the Gospel proclaiming he is the Light of the World, let us resolve to allow God to provide light for our path so that we may share the good news of this Light with all around us.

PARENTS JUST DON'T UNDERSTAND

Anybody remember the old rap song by the Fresh Prince, aka Will Smith, "Parents Just Don't Understand?" As we grow up, it is sometimes a struggle for us to imagine that our parents understand us. It can seem impossible that Mom and Dad remember the stress of exam week or peer pressure. We never saw them as children; we never saw their disappointed faces when they weren't invited to a party or their dashed hopes at a bad test grade. We never saw them homesick their first week of college or nervous to ask their crush to Homecoming. We're often the same way about God. We gripe about what He asks of us. "He doesn't understand sin — he's all good," we think. "He doesn't understand the temptation — He is perfect." In Scripture, God can be very much a father, telling us what we can and cannot do. And yet, in His divine genius, He is sometimes simply a man at a well, asking for a drink. For me, it turns out I didn't need to tell my parents anything about what I was going through as a kid — they knew already. What I needed was for them to tell me what to do, and how to do it. Similarly, we don't need to tell God about human nature. We need God to tell us about His nature. He's good enough to ask us for a drink, to enter into our humanity. But we have to remember, for our sakes, to have the humility to ask Him for something, too — the water that will quench our eternal thirst. ©LPi

THE STORY BEHIND THE STAINED-GLASS WINDOW IN THE SANCTUARY



High above the sanctuary is a magnificent stained-glass window depicting the history of the original San Antonio Mission founded on the banks of the Peace River in 1565. Designed exclusively for our church, the window is 10 feet in diameter and is naturally illuminated by a southern exposure. The window is dominated by a beautifully stylized yellow cross. Prominent in the upper window is a glorious sunrise in magnificent hues of blues, violets, roses, yellows, and gold. Traversing back and forth, the Peace River is highlighted in deep blue and flows downward to the San Antonio settlement. In the lower-left portion of the window, there is a representation of a Calusa Indian settlement. The Mission Chapel stands at the bottom and has three crosses. In front of the chapel are several Spanish Conquistadors and slightly to the left, two dark clothed figures represent the Spanish Jesuit priest and brother assigned to the mission. Other settlement buildings are seen to the left of the chapel.
