APA & Ministry Appeal

- Some of you may have received a letter from the Bishop recently about the upcoming **2022** Ministry Appeal. It may have been confusing to you, but there is no need to take any immediate action.
- I also hope you all received Father Paul's letter which explained that after the 2021 APA campaign finishes in January 2022 there will be no more APA and the Parish will no longer receive the benefits through "APA economics" but the needs of our Parish and our building fund will not diminish, so we urge you to keep this uppermost in your mind as you determine where to give donations in this coming year.
- In 2022 in place of APA we will be assessed 2% of all Parish collections to run the Diocese. The Ministry Appeal discussed in the Bishop's letter will support some of the ministries previously supported by part of APA.
- We will have more information on this new Ministry Appeal and our Parish Renewal in the Bulletins and from the Ambo in the first quarter of 2022. In the interim feel free to talk to a member of the Stewardship Committee: Steve Putnam, Gail Barney, Rob Hamill, Michael King, or Fred Restrepo.

Epiphany

Some countries and cultures celebrate Epiphany more prominently than Christmas. Our secular culture has likely removed all the decorations. But we know that we still have many reasons to celebrate.

This story of the visit by the Magi is found only in Matthew's gospel.. So many unconfirmed ideas, most scriptural based, is brought into this story. There is talk about 3 kings coming, however scripture does not mention any number. The gifts that were presented was gold, frankincense and myrrh. Isaiah 60:6 wrote "Caravans of camels shall cover you, dromedaries of Midian and Ephah; all from Sheba shall come bearing gold and frankincense, and heralding the praises of the Lord." The coming of the Magi is a fulfillment of this promise. The gifts of gold and frankincense are symbolic as they are given to kings.

Often we have in the past referred to "Magi" as Kings. The word "Magi" does not mean kings. "Magi" designated the persons' priestly caste. Matthew shows Persians (gentiles) are coming to worship Jesus. This is ultimately about who Jesus is, and what his mission will be.

The Magi worshiped the child Jesus, not the infant Jesus. This is very significant. When Magi arrive Jesus is no longer an infant. From Matthew's account it is clear that Mary is at her house. Matthew is keen to present Jesus as the light to the gentiles and his mission to the gentiles after his resurrection. The Salvation that Jesus proclaimed knows no bounds. St. Paul wrote "the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and partners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the Gospel." (Eph 3:6) No longer in God's chosen limited to only one people: God's promise is given to all who seek God in Christ, and they become members of the same body of Christ.

The Magi, strangers from a foreign country, traveled to the land of Israel and were welcomed into Jesus' home. They looked different, dressed different, and spoke a different language. Their faith was different, yet they were welcomed into the Holy Family. Are we open to encounter people of other cultures and faiths first and foremost on a human level? Can we deal with them politely, kindly, and with understanding? Are we open to welcome and associate with them? We have to become the light and love for others in todays' world. This is the meaning of Epiphany today, a challenge for all of us.~~ *Tather Paul*

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question:

What happens to a consecrated host if it accidentally falls to the ground?

Answer:

This a very practical question because, as we all know, accidents happen, even during the most careful celebration of the liturgy. The short answer to this question is that nothing happens to the consecrated host. The Real Presence of Jesus remains in the consecrated host or any consecrated wine that might accidentally be spilled.

Another question we might ask is: How should the minsters respond if the Eucharist is dropped or spilled? If this happens, the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of holy Communion should immediately pick up the dropped host and consume it. If it is a case of the Precious Blood being spilled, the minister would use the purificator (and additional purificators if needed) to clean the spill and then the area should be reverently washed as soon as the Mass is over and the water poured into the sacrarium (a special sink that is located in church sacristies for reverently disposing of holy water, the water used to clean sacred vessels, etc.).
