

We realize that it has been a difficult year for all, but we must remember to be Thankful for all our Blessings, and give generously to those less fortunate.




This is Blood Pressure screening weekend. Stop after Mass to have your blood Pressure checked.

WHILE YOUR DIASTOLIC BLOOD PRESSURE STAYS AT ABOUT THE SAME LEVEL ALL THE TIME, YOUR SYSTOLIC BLOOD PRESSURE CHANGES FREQUENTLY. THESE VARIATIONS REPRESENT YOUR BODY'S NORMAL RESPONSE TO YOUR DAILY ACTIVITIES AND STRESS.



MONTH 7 – Developing Baby – "I can look around!" Spiritual Adoption Program








#### STAINED-GLASS WINDOWS


As part of the overall Window Replacement Project, we have decided to add six (6) new stained-glass windows in the back of the Church where there is currently clear glass.

The cost for each window has been set at \$30,000 which will pay for the cost of the stained-glass window and also contribute funds to support the overall Window Replacement Project.

The style and colors of the new stained-glass windows will blend with all existing windows in the Church and the themes /scenes will be predetermined and approved by Fr. Paul.

Donors will be recognized with a plaque located near the window purchased. If interest exceeds the number of windows, a lottery will be held to determine the 'winners'.
