





# LAPTOP DONATION DRIVE FOR AREA FOSTER KIDS

The Children's Guardian Fund (CGF) & Sarasota Technology Users Group (STUG) have teamed up to collect used computer laptops or tablets.

With a long history of recycling and safety, the STUG sanitizes the hard drive with a seven-step process that protects the donor's information.

The STUG employs software similar to that used by the

U.S. Department of Defense to completely eliminate all data on the hard drives. They then refurbish the laptop and install software that is typically required for

school. Refurbished laptops are distributed to area students in foster or state care



through the CGF and the Guardian ad Litem Program.

# *\$250,000 MATCH GRANT*

Now through the end of March 2022, all funds collected via the BLUE Capital Fund Envelopes will be used 100% for the Window Replacement Project. A generous parish family has offered a \$250,000 Match Grant during this same period, so all funds will be matched dollar-for-dollar.


If you wish to gift funds to the church above and beyond your regular Offertory contribution, we ask that the funds be directed to the Capital Fund so that we can remain DEBT FREE while completing this major construction project on our property.

As part of the overall Window Replacement Project, we have decided to add six (6) new stained-glass windows in the back of the Church where there is currently clear glass. As of this writing, four (4) of the six (6) new stainedglass windows have been spoken for, with only two (2) remaining.

The cost for each window has been set at \$30,000 which will pay for the cost of the stained-glass window and also contribute funds to support the overall Window Replacement Project.

The style and colors of the new stained-glass windows will blend with all existing windows in the Church and the themes /scenes will be predetermined and approved by Fr. Paul. Donors will be recognized with a plaque located near the window purchased.
