"If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote St. Therese of Lisieux, "spring would lose its loveliness."

Who is God asking you to be today? There is an obvious answer that springs to mind right out of the gate. God wants me to be a good person (a good father, a good husband) today; today, God wants me to be a saint.

But this answer fails to get to the heart of the question. We are all striving today to serve the same Spirit, but we are given different gifts to do so. Let us examine our gifts and listen in the silence of our hearts to the direction of the Spirit. Then and only then, let us do whatever He tells us.

Day of Prayer for the LEGAL PROTECTION OF UNBORN CHILDREN

Respect The Respect Life collection being held on January 15th and 16th, 2022 helps turn "Crisis to Caring" for many of those that do not know how they will care for their baby. The collection benefits 25 pregnancy centers, 4 maternity homes, 3 healing after abortion Project Rachel, Rachel's Vineyard and Support After Abortion, and 3 college campus ministry programs within the Diocese of

St. Augustine. Up to 20% of the funds collected may be retained and used to help parish respect life initiatives at your parish. Please help turn *Crisis to Caring* by encouraging this year's annual Respect Life Collection.





As I write this, we are waiting to see if the diocese will call for more restrictive measures at church in response to the increasing numbers of COVID cases. We are currently at Phase 2. If we move to Phase 1, we will be required to remove the hymnals from the pews again.

At Mass, there are the parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which are repeated. The Proper is specific to that day's celebration. But the Ordinary is what remains the same. They are often referred to by their Latin name and include the Kyrie (which is not Latin), the Gloria, the Credo (the Creed), the Sanctus, the Benedictus (the Memorial Acclamation), and the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God).

In most places (including here), we try to use one Mass "setting" for these parts. A Mass setting is one set of such parts composed together in a consistent style. Our current default setting is Setting Two – Mass of Joy and Peace (#205 and following in the Gather hymnal).

As you know, we try to follow the principle of progressive solemnity. As we move to more solemn celebrations, we try to add things that show the greater solemnity of those celebrations. Midnight Mass and Easter Vigil would be the two most solemn celebrations of the liturgical year. There are different additions that we use here to show greater solemnity, including more candles, incense, greater decoration, and greater use of Latin.

The Vatican II document on the Sacred Liturgy tells us, "Nevertheless steps should be taken so that the faithful may also be able to say or to sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them (#54)." To comply with this statement, we need to find times in which we can do those parts in Latin so that we have that required ability going forward. It seems to make sense to do this as part of adding solemnity to the Christmas and Easter seasons. So, we use Setting Eleven – Cantus Missae (#301 and following in our Gather hymnal) for that. For the upcoming Easter season, we will make sure to post that first number of the Mass setting on the hymn board.

Again, as of this writing, I do not know whether, and for how long, we might have to remove the hymnals. If we remove the hymnals, we will try to stick with a familiar Mass setting. \sim *Fr. Bob*



SAINT OF THE WEEK --

St. Agnes Virgin & Martyr St. Agnes of Rome was born in 291 AD and raised in a Christian family. Agnes was very beautiful and belonged to a wealthy family. Her hand in marriage was highly sought after, and she had many high

ranking men chasing after her. However, Agnes made a promise to God never to stain her purity. Her love for the Lord was great and she hated sin even more than death! – Whenever a man wished to marry Agnes, she would always say, "Jesus Christ is my only Spouse."

The young men she turned away became so angry and insulted by her devotion to God and purity that they began to submit her name to authorities as a Christian follower. In great anger, [suitor] Procop accused her of being a Christian and brought her to his father, the Governor. The Governor promised Agnes wonderful gifts if she would only deny God, but Agnes refused. He tried to change her mind by putting her in chains, but her lovely face shone with joy.

Next he sent her to a place of sin, but an Angel protected her. At last, she was condemned to death. Even the pagans cried to see such a young and beautiful girl going to death. Yet, Agnes was as happy as a bride on her wedding day. She did not pay attention to those who begged her to save herself. "I would offend my Spouse," she said, "if I were to try to please you. He chose me first and He shall have me!" Then she prayed and bowed her head for the death-stroke of the sword.

Other accounts of Agnes' life hold the Prefect Sempronius responsible for her martyrdom. It is said he condemned the young girl to be dragged through the streets naked. Some versions of this story state that Agnes' hair grew instantly to cover her entire body and all the men who attempted to rape the beautiful virgin were immediately struck blind.

Agnes died a virgin-martyr at the age of 12 or 13 on 21 January 304. - Catholic.Org


