WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question:

This month, we had the March for Life and the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. What does the Church have to say about having respectful conversations between people who disagree?

Answer:

Christians are not removed from the world and its conflicts. Indeed, Jesus sends us "to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). Due to the complex nature of the human experience, the pressures of cultures that don't share Christian values, and the difficulty of living the Gospel, even people of good will have conflicts! The Church has disagreements within herself. This has been the case from the beginning. In the letters of Paul, we see him writing to churches who disagree on how to best live the Gospel in everyday life. And different teachers went to cities after Paul and sometimes preached conflicting messages on who Jesus was.

When we encounter people who disagree with us - on topics large and small - we must remember basic Christian values. Respect and compassion are critically important. We need to be good listeners to grasp another person's perspective. This dialogue doesn't mean we compromise our values or deny the truth. We may still disagree, but our conversation can be a lot more civil if we try to understand each other!

The spirit of the world is deceitful

Taking his cue from the First Reading of the Day, the Pope noted that St. John the Apostle speaks of "worldliness" when he says that "whoever is begotten by God conquers the world". He explained that this refers to our everyday struggle against a worldly spirit that is deceitful and lacks in consistency while "God's spirit is truthful".

"The spirit of the world is a spirit of vanity, of things that have no strength, no foundation and that are destined to fall" he said.

The spirit of the world divides families, communities, society. The Pope said the Apostle shows us the way reminding us that if we go by God's spirit, we will do good things.

Concretely, he says that "If anyone says, 'I love God' but hates his brother, he is a liar; for whoever does not love a brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen".

"If you are unable to love something you see" the Pope explained, "why would you love something you do not see?" Describing this as fantasy, he urged us to love "what you see, what you can touch, what is real. Not the fantasies that you do not see".

Francis also said that if one does not show his love for God in a concrete manner, it is not true love.

He then spoke of the spirit of the world which he said can be divisive and create splits in families, communities and society. "When divisions multiply, they bring hatred and war" he said.

Pope Francis went on to dwell on three signs that indicate that one does not love one's brother.

The first, he said, is actually a question we must all ask ourselves: "Do I pray for others? For those whom I like and for those whom I dislike?".

The second pertains to feelings of envy and jealousy and wishing someone ill: "Don't let these feelings grow" he said, "They are dangerous".

The third, he said, has to do with engaging in chatter - or gossip - that is harmful to others: "If I do this" he said, "I do not love God because with my words I am destroying another person".

Faith is victorious in the fight against the spirit of the world. Pope Francis concluded saying that the spirit of the world is conquered with the spirit of faith: believing that God is really in the brother and sister who are close to me.

Only faith, he said, gives us the strength to tread the path of true love. (Vatican News)

¿Se acuerda en un momento llegar a clase, sabiendo que tiene un examen por el cual no se preparó adecuadamente? Quizá era un examen sobre un libro clásico, o un examen de ciencia. ¿Sentía su corazón latir fuerte? ¿Sentía sudor en su frente? Quizá estaba considerando las maneras en que pudo haber evitado sentirse así. Y finalmente piensa: "¡Debí haber estudiado lo del examen!"

Dejar las cosas para el último momento, la indiferencia, no darse suficiente tiempo y ser terco son razones por las cuales fallamos de prepararnos bien cuando una situación importante llega. Nos falta un compromiso verdadero. Esto también puede ser verdad en nuestra vida espiritual. Podemos escoger llamarnos discípulos, pero no nos preparamos adecuadamente para esa jornada.

La sagrada escritura nos puede preparar plenamente para las circunstancias de la vida, pero no si fallamos en leerla. Las palabras contenidas allí son el Espíritu y vida para nosotros. Nos ayuda entender dónde cabemos dentro del Cuerpo de Cristo y cómo debemos responder a la llamada diario de Cristo Jesús. Los que viven una vida corresponsable deben estar comprometidos a leer y reflexionar la Palabra de Dios. Sabemos que debemos pasar tiempo con la Palabra, pero muchas veces fallamos. Cuando fallamos leer en la escuela, quizás fallamos y sacamos una marca baja. Cuando fallamos en la vida por no estar preparados, a veces las consecuencias son graves.

La manera como Lucas inicia el Evangelio y orienta al ilustre Teófilo a fin de comprender la solidez de la catequesis que este había recibido. El mensaje transmitido el ordenar los acontecimientos permite también a nosotros hoy, fijar nuestros ojos en Jesús. Así, nos damos cuenta de que, en Nazaret, Jesús proclama su misión: "Enseñaba en las sinagogas de los judíos y todos lo alababan" (Lucas 4:14). Los inicios son importantes porque dan base, son cimientos seguros para iniciar la proclamación de la buena nueva. Lucas tiene un excelente gusto literario. Leer su Evangelio siempre es un deleite ya que muestra claramente la misericordia de Dios por medio de su Hijo Jesús.

En su mensaje se destacan cuatro puntos importantes. 1. Jesús anuncia la buena noticia con palabras, acciones y milagros. Es decir, acciones concretas. Siempre acompañado del espíritu de Dios desde su Bautismo. 2. En la sinagoga proclama el conocido pasaje de Isaías 61:1ss. "El Espíritu del Señor esta sobre mí. Él me ha ungido para llevar las buenas noticias a los pobres, para anunciar la libertad a los cautivos y a los ciegos que pronto van a ver, para poner en libertad a los oprimidos y a proclamar el año de gracia del Señor" (Lucas 4; 18-19). El pasaje se puede resumir en lo siguiente: hacer el bien de parte de Dios a toda la humanidad. 3. Jesús anuncia que se ha cumplido la Escritura en él: "Hoy se cumplen estas palabras proféticas y a ustedes les llegan noticias de ello" (Lucas 4:21). 4. Fue en Nazaret donde dio comienzo la actividad pública de Jesús. ¿Crees que Jesús sigue actuando en su Iglesia? ¿Cómo?
