I, John, looked and heard the voices of many angels



WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED Choosing Organ Donation

Question:

Are Catholics allowed to donate their organs?

Answer:

Yes, Catholics are allowed to donate their organs. In fact, the Catechism of the Catholic Church praises this practice when it notes that, "Organ donation after death is a noble and meritorious act and is to be encouraged as an expression of generous solidarity" (no. 2296).

The Church has a series of guidelines for health care providers called The Ethical and Religious Directives for Catholic Health Services. This document helps us see organ donation as an act of charity, but it also reminds us that we have to be sure that donations of organs by living donors do not "sacrifice or seriously impair any essential bodily function and the anticipated benefit to the recipient is proportionate to the harm to the donor" (no. 30); trained medical professionals can help to make this assessment. In the case of organ donation at the end of life, we must be sure of the intentions of the donor or of their proxy are always respected, and that the dignity of the human body is always respected.

In the end, we can look to Pope Saint John Paul II and his encyclical Evangelium Vitae, where he noted that organ donation is a beautiful act of expressing the culture of life, when "performed in an ethically acceptable manner, with a view to offering a chance of health or even of life itself to the sick who sometimes have no other hope" (no. 86). ©LPI

What is a caseworker? Two Vincentians who visit a neighbor to evaluate eligibility and provide material and spiritual assistance. Help is focused on day-to-day needs such as food, hygiene, housing, utilities, clothing and furniture. The caseworkers assist by connecting neighbors to appropriate community resources for the help they need to get a step up to move forward with their lives in their time of need.

This past month caseworkers were able to direct a neighbor to the main office where personnel were available to help the neighbor with covid-19 rental assistance paperwork.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Could it be that God's image has become so soiled and distorted that it is hard for us to see it? Our self-serving agendas have done a great job twisting God's image into what profits us. We want our agenda to be God's agenda and use prayer as the convincing leverage we need. Worse still, our success and egocentric agenda often erases God's image completely, replacing it with our own. St. Oscar Romero instructs us that the Son of Man "dies on the cross to cleanse God's image, which is soiled in today's humanity, a humanity so enslaved, so selfish, so sinful." Striving to preserve control of our destinies at all costs, we fail to see the risen suffering servant, the Christ, standing right beside us.

Jesus, who suffered and died on a cross and was raised from the dead, corrects our soiled image of God. He shows us God as God is, not who we want to make God to be. God is the God of the poor, the weak, and the marginalized. He is the God who tenderly caresses us when we are suffering and hurting, assuring us that all will be safe and well. He is the God of equity, peace, justice, and compassion who wants happiness for each of His children, desiring their wellbeing and success. God goes where men and women are afraid to go, sitting with the lost, the broken, and the sorrowing. St. Oscar Romero challenges us to illuminate with "Christ's light ... even the most hideous caverns of the human person: torture, jail, plunder, want, chronic illness. The oppressed must be saved." The resurrection calls us to be God's microphone, a messenger, and a prophet (St. Oscar Romero).

Using eyes that see beyond the limited constructs and desires of our world, we can see the true and real Jesus standing before us, calling us to transformation and change. Asking us more than once, "do you love me?" We are beckoned to give an answer. Answering in the affirmative, it is now our task to feed the sheep and the lambs who belong to God. In short, equipped with the power of the resurrection and a corrected image of God our task is to make things better, brighter, holier, more life-giving, and just for all of God's children. Considering our choices, our interactions, our philosophies, and aspirations, how can we do this? ©LPi

Pope Francis: 'Values of sport can help prevent war'

Pope Francis tells members of a Roman rowing club that the spirit of true sport can cultivate human friendship and act as an important antidote to prevent war.

During an audience with members of a Roman rowing club on Saturday, Pope Francis referred again to the ongoing war in Ukraine with all its horrors, which he said cannot be forgotten and remind us the cruelty of which humanity is capable.

Promoting human friendship

Speaking to the members the "Reale Circolo Canottieri Tevere Remo" on the occasion of the 150th anniversary of its foundation, he remarked that the spirit of true sport is an important antidote to help prevent war.

"Cultivating human friendship prepares us not to fall into this tragedy and to think of the victims."

Healthy competition vs. logic of profit

Pope Francis noted that "the values of healthy competition, friendship and solidarity" are best expressed in amateur sport, noting that professional sport is more likely to be conditioned by "the logic of profit and of exasperated competition" which can even lead to violence.

He therefore encouraged the members of the rowing club "to persevere so that through sport activity children, young people and adults can cultivate the essential values of love for truth and justice, respect for creation, a taste for beauty and goodness, the search for freedom and of peace."

"If lived out correctly, sporting activity helps to establish good friendships and the building of a more serene and fraternal world, in which one supports and helps each other."

"Practicing sport with loyalty and a healthy competitive spirit" will "help you face up to the demanding race of life with courage and honesty, with joy and serene faith in the future, stopping to patiently wait for those who are slower and have more difficulty walking," Pope Francis concluded. Regalos disfrazados

¿Alguna vez has abierto un regalo y te preguntaste qué estaba pensando el donante?

No pondré en evidencia a ninguno de mis familiares o amigos aquí, pero basta con decir que creo que todos hemos sido el destinatario confuso de un suéter que no era de nuestra talla o una tarjeta de regalo para una tienda donde no compramos. Pero sonreímos de todos modos y dijimos lo mucho que significaba para nosotros, porque sabemos que cuando se trata de regalos, lo importante es el gesto.

El sufrimiento es muy parecido a eso: el regalo que nunca pediste y que realmente no quieres recibir. A veces miramos el sufrimiento y, como los apóstoles que ven a Jesús como un extraño en la orilla, no lo reconocemos por lo que puede ser. No apreciamos el catalizador que puede ser el sufrimiento para el cambio, el crecimiento, la gracia.

¿Cuál fue el regalo que recibiste disfrazado? ¿Fue una relación que te confundió y frustró? ¿Fue un trabajo que puso a prueba tu espíritu? ¿Un obstáculo que te detuvo en seco? ¿Un rechazo que amenazaba con romper tu espíritu?

Si vuelvo atrás y miro los peores regalos que he recibido, lo más probable es que no me gustaron porque no sabía qué hacer con ellos; eran más adecuados para los intereses de otra persona, para la vida de otra persona. Lo mismo ocurre con el sufrimiento. Estamos tentados a dejar de lado el sufrimiento cuando se nos presenta porque no encaja con la persona que somos. El sufrimiento está hecho para adaptarse a la persona que, Dios sabe, que tenemos la capacidad de convertirnos con Su gracia.

Aférrate a ese sufrimiento. A diferencia del suéter deformé, realmente será útil.
