What are the caseworker obligations? Caseworkers work in pairs to interview neighbors by phone first to schedule an at home visit. Together, they will visit the home to determine need, evaluate eligibility and make every effort to provide material and spiritual assistance face-to-face. If other needs become apparent, caseworkers assist by connecting neighbors to other appropriate community resources. Caseworkers to attend a monthly meeting to discuss cases. Meetings are held at 1:30 pm on the second Tuesday of each month.

This past month two caseworkers were able to help a mother with 6 kids with a utility bill, and food pantry schedules around the Naples area.

St. Finbarr's Conference group of St. Vincent DePaul is a Parish organization whose members come together as a network of friends to grow spiritually by providing person-to-person service to neighbors who are suffering or in need who live within the geographic boundaries of our Parish. Members help in several different areas which include casework, a food pantry, the meals on wheels program and the thrift stores. WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Saint Vs. Blessed

Question:

What is the difference between a "Saint" and a "Blessed"?

Answer:

The process of proclaiming someone as a saint in the Catholic Church has evolved over the course of many centuries. In the beginning, those honored as saints were almost exclusively biblical figures or martyrs. However, after the legalization of Christianity in the fourth century, new holy women and men came to be honored as saints, and this was often done by popular acclaim or by the local bishop or abbot.

It was Pope Gregory IX (who was pope from 1227 to 1241) who officially proclaimed that only the pope had the authority to add someone to the official list (the "canon") of saints. This is the meaning of the word "canonization."

Today, the saint-making process includes several steps, including detailed studies of the person's life and a recognition that they died as a martyr or lived a life of "heroic virtue." Once someone is recognized as a martyr or if a miracle is attributed to their intercession, they will be beatified and honored as "Blessed." This means that they can be celebrated by Catholics in a particular country or region or by the members of certain religious community. If another miracle occurs and is approved, then the "Blessed" is canonized and honored with the title "Saint," meaning that they are now officially recognized as a universal model of holiness and an intercessor. ©LPi

FCCB Releases Statement Marking 50 Years Since Roe v. Wade Decision

Florida’s Catholic bishops have released a joint statement that observes January 22, 2023 as marking 50 years since the U.S. Supreme Court decision in *Roe v. Wade*. The Catholic Church annually designates January 22 as a day of prayer and penance, called the “Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children.”

The full statement follows:

“Today marks 50 years since *Roe v. Wade*, the U.S. Supreme Court decision that imposed by judicial ‘fiat’ the most extreme abortion policy in the Western world. It deprived more than 63 million unborn children of their right to life and severely limited the ability of states to mitigate the harms of abortion through legislation.

On June 24, 2022, the U.S. Supreme Court’s landmark ruling in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women’s Health Organization* overturned *Roe*, allowing elected representatives at the state level to once again protect women and their children from abortion. This is a fruit of prayer, born of a commitment to justice.”

Los humildes de la tierra

Cuando pienso en las Bienaventuranzas, pienso en tazas de café coleccionables adornadas con las palabras *Bienaventurados los pacificadores*, con florecillas de color pastel estampadas en los espacios en blanco de las letras. Pienso en tarjetas de felicitación y tapices decorativos.
