

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Why Are There Liturgical Cycles?

Question:

Why Does the Church Have Different Liturgical Cycles?

Answer:

While most Catholics know that the Church Year is divided into various seasons (e.g. Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, etc.), many are unaware that the one Church Year is not like the one that follows. While the main seasons and feasts are the same from year to year, the 3-year cycle for Sundays and the 2-year cycle for weekdays means that, as a general rule, the readings in the Lectionary that we hear at Mass will change from year to year, helping us to have a richer encounter with Sacred Scripture. Each new cycle begins with the beginning of the liturgical year, the First Sunday of Advent.

The reasoning behind this innovation is outlined in Sacrosanctum Concilium, the "Dogmatic Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy" of the Second Vatican Council: "The treasures of the bible are to be opened up more lavishly, so that richer fare may be provided for the faithful at the table of God's word. In this way a more representative portion of the holy scriptures will be read to the people in the course of a prescribed number of years" (no. 51). This was fully achieved in 1969 when the new cycles of readings were approved by Pope Saint Paul VI. Seeking Christ in One Another

The funeral luncheon, the Irish wake, the vigil at an ailing loved one's bedside: in times of crisis, people gather. In moments of sadness, fear, and confusion, we gravitate toward one another. For some reason, the feelings are so much more bearable when we are not alone.

I'm sure that the disciples and their companions, gathered in the upper room after the Lord's Ascension, did all of the things we typically do at these functions. I'm sure they hugged and talked and shared food, processing together the remarkable events they had witnessed.

But we don't hear about any of that. We hear only that they prayed — fervently, and together.

Saint John Paul II famously said that "it is Jesus that you seek when you dream of happiness; He is waiting for you when nothing else you find satisfies you." And I think that, whenever we gather, in good times or in bad, we think we are seeking companionship — but we are actually seeking God.

As I think back on the last few crisis-gatherings my family has had, I try to remember when we have stopped everything to pray together. I can think of a few times, but to be honest, they are *too* few. We are usually occupied with more practical tasks: planning the funeral, talking to the doctor, making the decisions, ordering the food. Just trying to survive through it.


But this is the busywork of sorrow, and it is a waste of our time. We would do better to follow the example of the disciples and remember that, in these dire moments, God is waiting for us.

REFLEXION PARA LA LURGIA DEL DOMINGO 21 DE MAYO DEL 2023

La ascensión es como el desarrollo del acontecimiento de la Pascua, su plenitud, que todavía «madurará» más con el envío del Espíritu. Pascua, Ascensión y Pentecostés no son unos hechos aislados, sucesivos, que conmemoramos con la oportuna fiesta anual, sino un único y dinámico movimiento de salvación que ha sucedido en Cristo, nuestra Cabeza, y que se nos va comunicando en la celebración pascual de cada año.

Todas las lecturas de hoy iluminan el misterio de la Ascensión. Los Hechos de los Apóstoles nos narra la ascensión de Jesús a los cielos y su promesa del Espíritu Santo. El salmo se acomoda perfectamente a la fiesta y nos ayuda a entender que, subiendo al cielo, Jesús es entronizado como «rey de toda la tierra». Este aspecto está aún mejor desarrollado en la Carta a los Efesios, donde se insiste en que la resurrección ha otorgado a Cristo la plenitud del poder junto a Dios. Precisamente lo mismo que proclama el Resucitado en el evangelio de Mateo con el envío de los discípulos y su promesa de permanecer con ellos para siempre. Con atención escuchemos.

El salmo 46 no puede ser más adecuado para hoy. Invita a los pueblos a batir palmas porque «Dios asciende entre aclamaciones, el Señor, al son de trompetas». El salmista lo decía de Yahvé, con ocasión de alguna victoria. Nosotros, después de la Pascua del Señor, lo cantamos con entusiasmo confesando nuestra fe en la victoria de Cristo Jesús.

El pasaje de la carta de San Pablo a los Efesios, que leemos hoy, está ciertamente bien elegido para la solemnidad que celebramos: es un himno cristológico con el que nos invita a comprender en profundidad el misterio de Cristo y la «extraordinaria grandeza del poder» que desplegó Dios en Cristo, «resucitándolo de entre los muertos y sentándolo a su derecha en el cielo.

Lucas, en el inicio del libro de los Hechos de los Apóstoles, nos narra hoy el acontecimiento que celebramos este día: La Ascensión de Jesús a los cielos. Al mismo tiempo nos dispone ya para prepararnos al cumplimiento de la promesa de Cristo, el envío del Espíritu Santo, quien nos acompañará hasta la segunda venida de Cristo.


Ya casi al final del tiempo pascual, contemplaremos hoy la escena conclusiva del evangelio de Mateo. El Resucitado reúne a sus discípulos en Galilea y los envía a la misión universal, prometiéndoles estar con ellos hasta el final de los tiempos. Hoy está con nosotros, y nos preparamos para celebrar juntos esta gran fiesta.

Siervo de Dios padre Emil Kapaun fue un capellán militar estadounidense que sirvió heroicamente en el campo de batalla y dentro de un campo de prisioneros de guerra en Corea del Norte hasta su muerte. Mientras era prisionero de guerra, cuidó de otros prisioneros físicamente con alimentos y medicinas robados, y espiritualmente como sacerdote.
