

Giving To Those Who've Given a Lifetime

In December, from our tithes to serve those in need, we made a gift of \$3,000 to the Retirement Fund for Religious.

Those who've attended Catholic schools and universities, who've been involved in certain Catholic ministries, or who've visited monasteries, abbeys, and holy sites around the world surely have encountered men and women of the Catholic religious orders. These men and women typically have devoted their lives to following in Jesus' footsteps, to work in education, helping the poor, and preserving Catholic culture. Some of these orders include the Franciscans, Jesuits, Benedictines, and Carmelites.

In 1988, the Catholic bishops of the United States launched the Retirement Fund for Religious to provide for these Catholic sisters, brothers, and priests in the twilight of their careers. For most of their lives, the elder religious worked for little to no pay, and many took a vow of poverty. There are no 401(k) plans or pensions for them to live on in retirement. In most parishes, a second collection is taken, but at Saint Peter's we give as a parish through our tithing.

While the religious communities are financially responsible for the support and care of all members, these operate separately from the parish and diocesan structures of the Catholic Church, and there is a severe shortage of funding for this purpose.

Currently about two-thirds of the members of religious orders are age 70 or older, and they number more than 32,000 in the United States. The average annual cost for their care was more than \$42,000 per person, while the average annual security benefit for a religious is \$6,116.22.

St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta, who was one of the most famous members and founders of a religious order, once said, "We cannot all do great things, but we can do small things with great love." Those interested can learn more about the Retirement Fund for the Religious at www.retiredreligious.org.




