

ORDINARY TIME IN THE WINTER

During Ordinary Time, the Church focuses on "the Mystery of Christ itself honored in its fullness, especially on Sundays." During this time, the people of God might ask, "Born into this new reality, imitating Christ by our baptism, who are we now?" Who are we as Church and as individuals? During Ordinary Time, we can use our focus on our celebration of Sunday as a means to the answer, as each time we gather for Mass, we encounter the mystery that now is the foundation of our deepest identity: Christ's paschal mystery, which is the theme of all the seasons throughout the liturgical year. Our Sunday observance is not the work of a perfected people. Rather, it is a remedy for our imperfection, food to feed a hungry people. When we break and share bread together on Sunday, the day of the resurrection, for our good and the good of the world, we become what we receive; we know who we are.

Ordinary Time has green as its liturgical color. After the four weeks of Advent anticipation and the usual explosion of light at Christmas, Ordinary Time can provide a chance to return to the winter's quiet.

Gospel: Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21

"Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

Gospel Teaching:

This Sunday's Gospel starts with the prologue of Luke's Gospel where he describes what he wrote as a complete and accurate account of Jesus' life. As a prologue of Jesus' ministry, we hear of Jesus teaching in the local synagogue and reading a passage from Isaiah that describes a prophet sent to bring good news, healings, and freedom to the poor and neglected people. After the reading, Jesus uses the quote above to indicate that He is

that prophet. Throughout Luke's Gospel, Old Testament readings are used to show how what had been said by the prophets is fulfilled by Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. We should also strive to bring good news, healing, and freedom to those in need.




SYNOD 2021-2023: For a Synodal Church



Holocaust Remembrance Day Commemoration

JPII COMPUTER SCIENCE PRINCIPLES STUDENTS EXPLORED CYBERSECURITY

JPII Computer Science Principles students explored cybersecurity situations and solutions by playing a card game. Different identity-compromising events were drawn from the deck and displayed in front of each player. "Students had to then draw cards to protect themselves from the other player while also trying to attack the opposing player's events with matching cards," said Cadra Rooney, CSP teacher and robotics advisor. "The game ends when one player has documented that their 13 categories of personal information have been placed at risk."

According to Mrs. Rooney, CPS students will continue to develop their cyber skills through hands-on virtual labs, deciphering messages using cryptography programs, and participating in the PicoCTF competition through Carnegie Mellon University.

"Learning these skills guides students to make informed and ethical decisions while online realizing their own digital footprint," she said. "Moreover, these skills help students prepare for the future." Cybersecurity continues to be one of the largest employment gaps in the US with currently more than 465,000 unfilled cybersecurity jobs nationwide.






