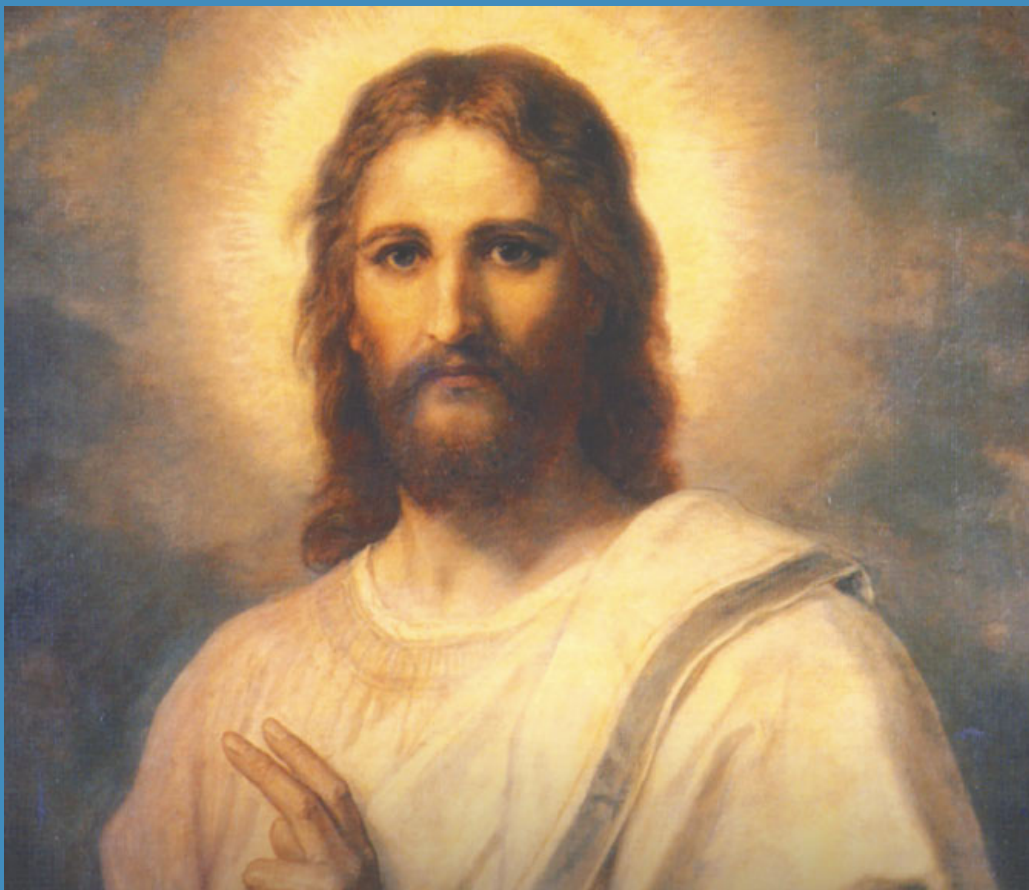

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

July 27, 2025

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Luke 11:1-13

Once I went to a hospice facility to celebrate Last Rites for an elderly dying man. His family had told me that he had been uncommunicative for days. At the conclusion of the ritual, we began to recite the Our Father prayer. To everyone's surprise, his lips moved, clearly mouthing the words to the Lord's prayer. Stripped of most of his faculties, the man could still pray those precious God-given petitions. A lifetime of prayer had planted the words even deeper than his failing consciousness.



Do we want the Lord's prayer to be as deeply embedded in us? If we want to be people of hope, we should. Recall that our Lord immediately follows the prayer by saying: "Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you" (Luke 11:9). We only ask, search and knock because we hope that the request is not in vain. Everything we could possibly hope for is contained in the prayer. Praying the Our Father deepens our hope.

We should consciously pour all our hopes into the Lord's prayer; we should allow it to be an expression of hope, not simply rote words. Then, over time, it builds up our hope in God. It sinks deep into our souls and bodies. How blessed we are when these words of hope are on our lips, even when everything else seems to fail.

When I Called, You Answered

Some of us have that friend about whom we are constantly discovering new things. Maybe we've known this person for ten or even twenty years, and one day at lunch we'll find out they're a direct descendant of a dead president or they once met a major celebrity.

"You never asked," they'll say with a shrug.

As annoying as this can be, it makes perfect sense, doesn't it? We never asked. There is something strangely sacred about the act of asking for something. It requires humility. It requires grace. It requires us to be awake, to be aware, to be vulnerable.

Too often we fall into a pattern of entitlement, even when it comes to information. We go through life thinking that a great cosmic conveyor belt of what we want is going to roll on past us, and we'll barely even have to extend our arms. We read our Bible and we hear all these amazing promises from the Father who loves us, and we get sort of complacent. He's got this, we think, and we shut our eyes to take a snooze on the road trip of life, confident that someone else is going to look out for stop signs and wrong turns.

It's true: God's got this. He is going to take care of us. But He wants us to be in relationship with Him. He wants us to be an active, receptive participant in our own salvation. See his patience with Abraham's entreaties on behalf of the righteous of Sodom: He wants to answer, not simply to tell.

He wants us to stay awake for the drive.

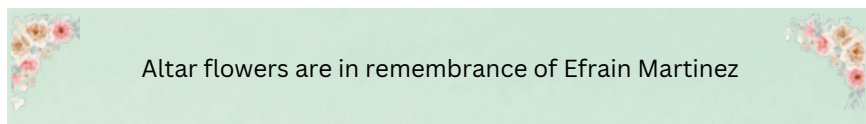

SPOTLIGHT MINISTRY

Interested in ways to get more active in the parish? Our ministries offer many things including faith & fellowship as well as volunteer opportunities, and more! This week, we are featuring our

LITURGICAL MINISTRIES

USHERS

The Usher Ministry is a special ministry, which often allows you to be the first encounter a visitor or potential parishioner has with our Church. The main goal of this ministry is to welcome parishioners and guests to the Mass and to perform certain functions during the Mass, such as helping with seating, orchestrating the offertory collection process and ensuring an orderly distribution of communion, both for those going to the front to receive and facilitation for those that need it at their seats. We also assist with distribution of bulletins and other items after the service. It is our responsibility to provide a safe and comfortable environment for all in attendance, so they may focus on the Mass and fully participate in the sacrament. We are also responsible for assisting with any needs those in attendance may have, while ensuring the Mass is distraction free for other parishioners and the presiding priest.

It's a casual ministry and a lot of fun, as you meet many folks while working and getting to know "Mass regulars". Ushers choose the Masses they want to work, with the usual commitment being once or twice a month. It is a very flexible schedule that allows for travel and other commitments.

Please think about joining us! You can volunteer alone, with a friend, or even as a family. We welcome new ushers to all our Masses but we are extremely short at the 10 am and Noon Masses. We would love to have you join our team!

SACRISTANS

Being a Sacristan is a very special blessing, and your role as a Sacristan is to prepare for the celebration of the liturgy of the Mass by setting up the books, the vessels, and the bread and wine. You may be called to assist with other liturgical celebrations as well, such as Confirmation, Baptism, Funerals and Marriage. Your service will include weekday and weekend Masses.

Setting up for Mass you will turn on the lights in the Church, turn on the Sound System, prepare the Creedence Table with the Priest's Chalice, Water and Wine Cruets and the Lavabo bowl and towel. Prepare the ciborium's with the proper number of hosts to be consecrated at the Mass. You are the main point person for the clergy and liturgical ministers and must be able to attend to anything the clergy may need. After the Mass, you are responsible for putting away all the sacred vessels.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION

The primary mission of an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion is to serve our parish by assisting our priest to distribute the Most Holy Eucharist during Mass. Through this humble service, you are a servant of Christ fulfilling His will to feed the hungry. By sharing the Body and Blood of our Lord, we are formed more intimately into the Body of Christ bringing us into communion with Him and with one another.

To join this Ministry you will attend a training session at our church after which you will be commissioned by our parish priest during Mass. You will serve during the Mass of your choice on a rotating schedule. All practicing Catholics in good standing and who are confirmed may apply to be an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion. Applications are available in the church office and trainings will be advertised in the bulletin in the fall and in the spring. Come, join this ministry and experience a closer connection to Christ through the sacred act of distributing the Most Holy Eucharist.

The Creagans are proud sponsors to the Light to the Nations Campaign. They believe in building our new church and they feel it is so important to be a part of future at SJP2.



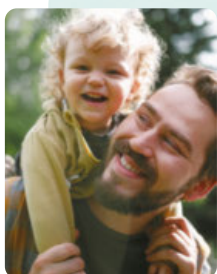

FAITH FORMATION

Catechist and Small Group Leaders Needed!

Are you looking to get involved at SJPII and love working with our youth? If so, we would love to invite you to prayerfully consider ministering as a catechist or small group leader this year!

What does a K-6 catechist do at SJPII?

A catechist helps lead small groups sessions of children in grades K-6 at our Family Lesson Meetings that take place either on a Thursday evening or Sunday afternoon about twice a month.

What about confirmation small group leaders?

Small group leaders work with teens in our confirmation programs. Confirmation Year 1 meets on Wednesday nights in either our Blaze or Fraternus groups. Confirmation Year 2 meets on Sunday evenings.

What are the requirements?

Small group leaders and K-6 catechists should be at least 18 years old and complete a Safe Environment training (which includes attending a Protecting God's Children workshop and fingerprinting).

We will be offering the PGC workshop on Saturday, August 30th 9am-12pm.

How do I learn more?

- There will be a **confirmation small group leader** interest meeting on Monday, August 4th @ 7pm via zoom.
- There will be a **K-6 catechist** interest meeting on Thursday, August 7th @ 7pm via zoom.

MONTHLY FIRST FRIDAY AND FIRST SATURDAY DEVOTIONS

Every year, the month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary!



In 1925, in Pontevedra, Spain, Mary requested of Sr. Lucia to make reparation to Her Immaculate Heart on five consecutive first Saturdays by going to confession, receiving Holy Communion, praying five decades of the Rosary, and meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary for fifteen minutes. There are five types of offenses against Our Lady, which is why there are five Saturdays in reparation. Our Lady made a promise that She would assist anyone at the hour of death, with the graces necessary for salvation, for those who practiced this devotion during their life. What a promise!

At our parish, we celebrate the First Saturday Devotion--also called Communion of Reparation to the Immaculate Heart-- by offering Mass at 9am on the first Saturday of each month. The Scriptural Rosary is prayed aloud between 7:45-8:45am, with meditations shared on each mystery, followed by Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. Confession is available 30 minutes before every Mass at our parish.

Jesus told Sr. Lucia: "I want My Church toput the devotion to this Immaculate Heart beside the devotion to My Sacred Heart."

In addition, there is 24-Hour Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament which begins after the First Friday Mass at 8:30 and continues until 8:45am on First Saturday. If you can make time or prayer during these hours, please come anytime. Sitting in silence, reading the Scriptures, journaling your thoughts, or reading a spiritual book are all ways you can invite the Holy Spirit to be with you in Adoration. There are hours of musical devotion between 7-9pm on Friday, where you can come join in praising God in song.

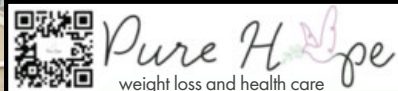
