

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK...

DEAR FRIENDS,

This weekend we celebrate Mother's Day. I would like first of all to wish a happy feast day to all the mothers. Something that strikes me about this feast is the cultural shock that comes with it. In my Congolese culture, we call every woman "Maman" out of respect, child or senior, married or single, with child or childless indistinctively. So, please bear with me. When I wish a "Happy Mother's Day" to every female person, it is both out of respect and in recognition for the dignity of and the sacrifices women accept in fulfilling their ministries with motherly hearts.

In our daily life, we all are tempted to find solace in different places and around many people. These choices can lead us either to some kind of peace or even to the worst. And we happen to regret those choices. Today, Christ reminds us where true peace and comfort are, namely in and with Him. Because he is love! He invites us to remain in His love because in Him and with him there is no deception.

When Christ invites us to remain in him, the risk would be to understand it as being besides him or as simple companionship. Rather, Christ calls us to life of communion with Him. This communion leads us to St. Paul's confession that "this present life, it is no longer I who live but Christ living in me, within me..." Thus, the intimate communion to which we are invited goes beyond simple feelings; it is a call to everlasting desire for communion in love. The consequence of such communion is the experience of the joy that flows from the love God has for us and the one we are meant to show for one another as proof of the life of Christ within us. Our joy will be complete only in so far as we love the way Christ loves us, namely, to be able to lay down our own lives for the sake of others.

But what does it mean for us to lay down our life for the sake of others? The experience of martyrdom, which means bearing witness, calls us first of all to see Christ present in each person in front of us. Once we get to that level of identifying Christ with every person we see, we will then strive to be able to act towards them in the very same way we would have acted towards Christ. This is how we can bear fruit that will remain, that is to leave a positive impact or imprint in the lives of those who happen to encounter us.

As we offer our prayers for all mothers, living and deceased, and thank God for the blessing of Jesus Christ who strengthens us as we remain in Him, let us continue to pray for one another and for our parish family.

QUERIDOS AMIGOS,

Este fin de semana celebramos el Día de la Madre. En primer lugar, quisiera desear una feliz fiesta a todas las madres. Algo que me sorprende de esta fiesta es el choque cultural que la acompaña. En mi cultura congoleña, llamamos "maman" a toda mujer por respeto, sea niña o mayor, casada o soltera, con hijos o sin hijos indistintamente. Así que por favor tengan paciencia conmigo. Cuando le deseo un "Feliz Día de la Madre" a toda mujer, es tanto por respeto como en reconocimiento a la dignidad y los sacrificios que las mujeres aceptan al cumplir sus ministerios con un corazón maternal.

En nuestra vida diaria, todos tenemos la tentación de encontrar consuelo en diferentes lugares y alrededor de muchas personas. Estas elecciones pueden llevarnos a algún tipo de paz o incluso a lo peor. Y resulta que lamentamos esas elecciones. Hoy, Cristo nos recuerda dónde están la verdadera paz y consuelo, es decir, en Él y con Él. ¡Porque es amor! Nos invita a permanecer en su amor porque en él y con él no hay engaño.

Cuando Cristo nos invita a permanecer en él, el riesgo sería entenderlo como estar junto a él o como simple compañía. Más bien, Cristo nos llama a una vida de comunión con él. Esta comunión nos lleva a la confesión de San Pablo de que "esta vida presente, ya no soy yo quien vive, sino Cristo viviendo en mí, dentro de mí..." Así, la comunión íntima a la que estamos invitados va más allá de los simples sentimientos; es una llamada al deseo eterno de comunión en el amor. La consecuencia de tal comunión es la experiencia del gozo que fluye del amor que Dios tiene por nosotros y el que debemos mostrarnos unos a otros como prueba de la vida de Cristo en nosotros. Nuestro gozo será completo solo en la medida en que amemos como Cristo nos ama, es decir, para poder dar nuestra propia vida por el bien de los demás.

Pero, ¿qué significa para nosotros dar nuestra vida por el bien de los demás? La experiencia del martirio, que significa dar testimonio, nos llama ante todo a ver a Cristo presente en cada persona que tenemos delante. Una vez que lleguemos a ese nivel de identificar a Cristo con cada persona que veamos, nos esforzaremos por poder actuar hacia ellos de la misma manera que hubiéramos actuado hacia Cristo. Así es como podemos dar frutos que permanecerán, es decir, dejar un impacto positivo o una huella en la vida de quienes se encuentren con nosotros.

Mientras ofrecemos nuestras oraciones por todas las madres, vivas y fallecidas, y agradecemos a Dios por la bendición de Jesucristo que nos fortalece mientras permanecemos en Él, continuemos orando los unos por los otros y por nuestra familia parroquial.

READINGS

FIRST READING ACTS 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

When Peter entered, Cornelius met him and, falling at his feet, paid him homage. Peter, however, raised him up, saying, "Get up. I myself am also a human being." Then Peter proceeded to speak and said, "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him." While Peter was still speaking these things, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the word. The circumcised believers who had accompanied Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit should have been poured out on the Gentiles also, for they could hear them speaking in tongues and glorifying God. Then Peter responded, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit even as we have?" He ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.

SECOND READING 1 JN 4:7-10

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is of God; everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God. Whoever is without love does not know God, for God is love. In this way the love of God was revealed to us: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might have life through him. In this is love: not that we have loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as expiation for our sins.

GOSPEL READING JN 15:9-17

Jesus said to his disciples: "As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love. "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete. This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing. I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father. It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name he may give you. This I command you: love one another."

Love one another. The greatest commandment, the simplest commandment — and if you've ever loved anyone, you know it's also the hardest.

I'm man enough to admit it. I've seen one or two of those cheesy Hallmark movies that are especially popular around the holidays. Boy meets Girl. Boy and Girl encounter a catastrophic roadblock to their relationship — they're coaches of rival high school volleyball teams, or he runs a dog kennel and she works at a feline rescue, so it could never, ever work out, right? But sprinkle a little movie magic over the whole situation and Boy and Girl find what Hallmark tells us is true love.

I could make a list of all the things that are inaccurate about these movies, and something I would put right near the top — maybe even above the sometimes-unbelievable storylines — is the idea that love is a feeling.

See, I'm not sure if it's accurate to call these movies love stories. Attraction stories, sure. But if you've ever forgiven someone who's hurt you, nursed a dying parent, gotten up for an infant's night feeding or let

your kid have the last piece of cake, you know that real love is a verb. It's something you do. And it is almost always a choice.

Love one another. How often do we hear this? How often do we think about what it really means? How often do we take a moment to consider the action Jesus is asking us to take and the choice he is asking us to make?

June 5—Sacrament of Confirmation, 12:00 pm at St. Catherine of Siena. Please arrive 1 hour before start time.


