FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK...

DEAR FRIENDS,

The story of the Young rich man who asked Jesus what he should do to enter the kingdom of heaven comes to my mind while reading today's gospel. "God master, he said, "what should I do to inherit eternal life?"

I would say that this question is still ours today as we strive to follow Christ. The answer for us today is even simpler and less challenging than the one He gave to the rich young man: "Go and sell all that you have, and give it to the poor; then come and follow me." Christ rather calls us to true freedom; the kind of freedom that goes beyond a simple feeling or attitude of doing whatsoever I want for my own sake. This freedom invites us to look around us and discover the chains that keep us from living as children of God. But what can really refrain us from living our identity and commitment as children of God? What does impair our freedom? The response is given us in the readings we listen to today.

In today's gospel, Christ brings us to a new understanding of what can enslave us. The common tendency is to see the obstacle to our true freedom in someone else; the one standing in front of me. And we point fingers and accuse one another as the source and the cause of our misfortune. Christ wants us look not far from us but precisely in ourselves. In today's gospel he wants us to search within us to find out the chains that enslave us: our eyes, hands, mouth, and mostly our hearts. These are the obstacles which hinder and block our journey to heaven, because they lead us to sin. Or more precisely, they are the instruments and the means we use to sin. Our eyes enslave us when they keep us away from seeing in one another nothing else but the image of God. It is only when we let God purify our eyes that we can be able to see His wonders and the goodness in other peoples around us. As long as our eyes will be blinded by anger, jealousy, prejudice and every kinds of evil, we will always remain slaves of sin, and the kingdom of God will remain away from our reach. Our hands enslave us when we use them to destroy and take something that does not belong to us. Our mouths enslave us and hinder our access to the kingdom of God when we use them as instruments to disparage others, to curse and to entertain gossip and defamation...

True freedom for us today is to let God free us from these bondages to look for happiness to God rather than to ourselves. As we strive to surrender to God's will for an experience of the true freedom of God's children, let us continue to pray for one another and for our parish family.

QUERIDOS AMIGOS,

La historia del joven rico que le preguntó a Jesús qué debía hacer para entrar en el reino de los cielos me viene a la mente mientras leo el evangelio de hoy. "Dios maestro, dijo," ¿qué debo hacer para heredar la vida eterna? "

Yo diría que esta pregunta sigue siendo nuestra hoy mientras nos esforzamos por seguir a Cristo. La respuesta para nosotros hoy es aún más simple y menos desafiante que la que le dio al joven rico: "Ve y vende todo lo que tienes y dáselo a los pobres; entonces ven y sígueme ". Cristo más bien nos llama a la verdadera libertad; el tipo de libertad que va más allá de un simple sentimiento o actitud de hacer lo que quiero por mi propio bien. Esta libertad nos invita a mirar a nuestro alrededor y descubrir las cadenas que nos impiden vivir como hijos de Dios. Pero, ¿qué puede realmente impedirnos vivir nuestra identidad y compromiso como hijos de Dios? ¿Qué perjudica nuestra libertad? La respuesta se nos da en las lecturas que escuchamos hoy.

En el evangelio de hoy, Cristo nos lleva a una nueva comprensión de lo que puede esclavizarnos. La tendencia común es ver el obstáculo a nuestra verdadera libertad en otra persona; el que está frente a mí. Y señalamos con el dedo y nos acusamos unos a otros de ser la fuente y la causa de nuestra desgracia. Cristo quiere que miremos no lejos de nosotros, sino precisamente en nosotros mismos. En el evangelio de hoy, él quiere que busquemos dentro de nosotros para encontrar las cadenas que nos esclavizan: nuestros ojos, manos, boca y principalmente nuestro corazón. Estos son los obstáculos que obstaculizan y bloquean nuestro viaje al cielo, porque nos llevan al pecado. O más precisamente, son los instrumentos y los medios que usamos para pecar. Nuestros ojos nos esclavizan cuando nos impiden ver en el otro nada más que la imagen de Dios. Solo cuando dejamos que Dios purifique nuestros ojos, podremos ver sus maravillas y la bondad de los demás pueblos que nos rodean. Mientras nuestros ojos estén cegados por la ira, los celos, los prejuicios y todo tipo de maldad, siempre seremos esclavos del pecado y el reino de Dios permanecerá lejos de nuestro alcance. Nuestras manos nos esclavizan cuando las usamos para destruir y tomar algo que no nos pertenece. Nuestras bocas nos esclavizan y obstaculizan nuestro acceso al reino de Dios cuando las usamos como instrumentos para menospreciar a los demás, maldecir y entretener chismes y difamaciones ...

La verdadera libertad para nosotros hoy es dejar que Dios nos libere de estas ataduras para buscar la felicidad en Dios y no en nosotros mismos. Mientras nos esforzamos por rendirnos a la voluntad de Dios por una experiencia de la verdadera libertad de los hijos de Dios, continuemos orando los unos por los otros y por nuestra familia parroquial.

NM 11:25-29

Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his reward. "Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life maimed than with two hands to go into Gehenna, into the unquenchable fire. And if your foot causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life crippled than with two feet to be thrown into Gehenna. And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out. Better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into Gehenna, where 'their worm does not die, and the fire is not quenched.'"

STEWARDSHIP: BREAKING THE STEWARDSHIP MOLD

Have you noticed how we always tend to pigeonhole one another — and ourselves? “I could never serve on the Parish Council. That’s for Rick and Ellen and that whole group of people who have done it for years.” “Greg takes care of faith formation in the parish — he always has. He doesn’t need my help.” “I can’t afford to give the big bucks like those families who sit up front can. My offering wouldn’t matter even if I did increase it.”

Thinking like this is a good indication that we aren’t in conversation with God about what His will is for our lives. If we have already decided what we are and are not meant to do, we aren’t likely to pray over it, to discern it.

We have to be open to the spirit of the Lord wherever it leads us, regardless of what we or others have come to expect from us. We human beings come to believe that we are such good judges of what others can offer — or what we ourselves can offer. But God has plans for us to which we aren’t privy. God calls everyone to serve Him in the way that pleases Him best, and only He can decide what that is. Everyday Stewardship demands a continual accounting of who we can be, what we can offer — even if it’s outside our comfort zone, even if it’s something that never occurred to us before.

There’s only one Person who can tell us what God wants from us. Do we even think to ask Him?


