FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK...

DEAR FRIENDS,

Charity towards impoverished communities constitutes one of the hallmarks of our faith. Saint Paul tirelessly encouraged different communities he founded and that were blessed to demonstrate their faith and love for God through their support for other communities that were less fortunate, to boost their missionary activities. The Church has carried out that same concern for the poor as one of her identities and missions. We are the Church and we are meant to continue and support that honorable activity.

Next weekend, we are going to welcome to Holy Cross Sisters Servants of Jesus, the High Priest, from Vietnam. Spread throughout the world to support the missionary activities of the Church, especially in education and service to the poor, the Servants of Jesus, the High Priest are established in our diocese in Largo and will be serving at The Holy martyrs of Vietnam Parish, here in St. Petersburg in a very short future. They come to us to ask for support and help to carry out their missionary activities.

The word of God we listen to this weekend invites us to discern the reflections and thoughts of our hearts. STEWARDSHIP: IF HEAVEN WERE LIKE HARVARD

There's no getting around it: life on earth can seem easier if you're rich. Most of the bodily and material needs a person could have are fulfilled if you've got a little bit of money behind you. So why doesn't this same theory apply to entering the kingdom of Heaven? Why isn't Heaven like an Ivy League school, where a connection and a hasty tuition check might open a lot of doors?

When you think about it, the virtues required to enter Heaven — things like charity and justice and courage — should be even closer within the grasp of those who never had to worry about where their food is coming from. In theory, your capacity for good works should only increase with the resources at your disposal.

The same is true for stewardship potential. Let's say I've got a lot of talent. Maybe I've got a lot of free time. On paper, it should be easier for me to give freely of these gifts, because I have the luxury that eluded the widow and her two coins: I can see my ample gift being put into action, when so many can only offer what they have and remind themselves that God sees it and appreciates it.

But here we get into the mess of humanity: if we have a lot of something, it means we have a lot of

something we could use any way we want. And then we hear the whisper of the serpent: *Think of what this (money, time, talent) could do for you.*

May we pray for God to give us the heart of the widow, no matter our resources.

VISITING RELIGIOUS SISTERS OCTOBER 16-17

The "Servants of Jesus, the High Priest" is a Vietnamese Catholic Religious Women's Congregation. It



was founded by Father Joseph Maria Pham in 1966 and was canonically approved by Bishop Dominic Lang Nguyen in the Diocese of Xuan Loc, the South of Vietnam in 1984. Since then, the Congregation has been grown tremendously. Currently, there are 250 sisters, 25 novices and 60 postulants. Its charism is to pray and to support priests' ministries. Currently, eighteen communities are serving in parishes in ten dioceses in Vietnam and two in the U.S.

The Community in Largo was established in 2012; currently, sisters are going to school and are serving at Holy Martyrs of Vietnam

Parish in the Diocese of St. Petersburg.

Please pray and support the Community in Largo. Their challenges in a new country, such as language, cultures, finance...are real. During the weekend of October 16-17, 2021 sisters Maria Phuong Nguyen and Mary Huong Nguyen are going to visit our parish to share with us their vocations, their ministries, and their plans for their congregation in our diocese.




