# FROM THE BISHOP'S DESK...

## SYNOD ON SYNODALITY

*This is a continuation of last week's installment of FAQ about the upcoming Synod on Synodality in 2023.*

### 5. Why now?

Pope Francis is reading the signs of the times and is seeking to develop "synodality" as a tool for the bishops in their role of governing the Church. In a world hurting from a pandemic, extreme weather conditions, massive migration, poverty, violence and moral relativism, the Church is asking us to "walk by faith" (2 Corinthians 5:7) and pray for guidance from the Holy Spirit.

Pope Francis has called this moment in human history "a time of reckoning." The themes from the Synod on Synodality can help us to understand why now is the right time to consider synodality more deeply:

a. Communion – Amidst so much suffering and isolation, we see clearly that we must come together as communities in the local Church. In prayerful communion, we gain insight into the ways of the Holy Spirit. When the Church gathers for the Eucharist, the mission of the Church is best understood. Thus, the life of the ecclesial communities and parishes, the importance of which we recognize now more than ever, roots and orients our practice of synodality and propels us forward.

b. Participation – This moment in which the Church responds to the global pandemic calls for the Church to look forward, not backwards, and to revitalize its mission of bringing the Good News to all. To undertake this mission, all the local Churches (dioceses) must reflect on the insights that the Holy Spirit has given to their faithful. The gentle call of invitation to the full practice of Catholic life, with the Eucharist at the center of all the Church does, is an integral part of this "walking together."

c. Mission – By reading the signs of the times and listening to what the Holy Spirit has spoken in the hearts of the faithful, dioceses will gain a deeper understanding of the mission entrusted to each of them. Like a mosaic, the vision for each diocese is formed through attention to the needs of the faithful, to the need for renewal, and to the life of the local community who gathers in response to the gentle invitation of the Lord to worship Him, to be sanctified by Him, and to speak, individually and collectively, with the prophetic voice of His Holy Spirit.

The synodal process is a pilgrimage of the whole People of God in discerning the way forward for the Church, locally and worldwide, at this moment in time. Anyone who has been on a pilgrimage knows that the journey there is not just travelling, but an integral part of the whole. The culmination of the synodal process in 2023 will be an important moment in the pilgrimage but not an end point.

## SÍNODO SOBRE SINODALIDAD

*Esta es una continuación de la entrega de preguntas frecuentes de la semana pasada sobre el próximo Sínodo sobre sinodalidad en 2023.*

### 5. ¿Por qué ahora?

El Papa Francisco está leyendo los signos de los tiempos y busca desarrollar la "sinodalidad" como una herramienta para los obispos en su función de gobierno de la Iglesia. En un mundo que sufre por una pandemia, condiciones climáticas extremas, migración masiva, pobreza, violencia y relativismo moral, la Iglesia nos pide "caminar por fe" (2 Corintios 5: 7) y orar por la guía del Espíritu Santo.

El Papa Francisco ha llamado a este momento en la historia de la humanidad "un tiempo de ajuste de cuentas". Los temas del Sínodo sobre sinodalidad pueden ayudarnos a comprender por qué ahora es el momento adecuado para considerar la sinodalidad con más profundidad:

una. Comunió - En medio de tanto sufrimiento y aislamiento, vemos claramente que debemos unirnos como comunidades en la Iglesia local. En la comunió en oraci3n, obtenemos conocimiento de los caminos del Esp3ritu Santo. Cuando la Iglesia se re3ne para la Eucarist3a, se comprende mejor la misi3n de la Iglesia. As3, la vida de las comunidades y parroquias eclesiales, cuya importancia reconocemos ahora m3s que nunca, enraiza y orienta nuestra pr3ctica de la sinodalidad y nos impulsa hacia adelante.

B. Participaci3n: este momento en el que la Iglesia responde a la pandemia mundial exige que la Iglesia mire hacia adelante, no hacia atr3s, y revitalice su misi3n de llevar la Buena Nueva a todos. Para emprender esta misi3n, todas las Iglesias locales (di3cesis) deben reflexionar sobre las intuiciones que el Esp3ritu Santo ha dado a sus fieles. El suave llamado de invitaci3n a la pr3ctica plena de la vida cat3lica, con la Eucarist3a en el centro de todo lo que hace la Iglesia, es parte integral de este "caminar juntos".

C. Misi3n - Al leer los signos de los tiempos y escuchar lo que el Esp3ritu Santo ha hablado en el coraz3n de los fieles, las di3cesis obtendr3n una compresi3n m3s profunda de la misi3n encomendada a cada una de ellas. Como un mosaico, la visi3n de cada di3cesis se forma a trav3s de la atenci3n a las necesidades de los fieles, a la necesidad de renovaci3n y a la vida de la comunidad local que se re3ne en respuesta a la suave invitaci3n del Se3or a adorarlo, a ser santificados por 3l, y hablar, individual y colectivamente, con la voz prof3tica de Su Esp3ritu Santo.

El proceso sinodal es una peregrinaci3n de todo el Pueblo de Dios para discernir el camino a seguir para la Iglesia, a nivel local y mundial, en este momento. Cualquiera que haya estado en peregrinaci3n sabe que el viaje no es solo un viaje, sino una parte integral del todo. La culminaci3n del proceso sinodal en 2023 ser3 un momento importante en la peregrinaci3n, pero no un punto final.





## DID YOU KNOW...

That the original Advent wreath originated in Germany? Actually, most of our decorations for Advent and Christmas are of German origin. December in Germany is dark and weary. The sun is tucked away behind the dark gray clouds that cover the sky. It was a gloomy time of year, and Christmas became a beacon of light and hope for Germans. As Christians, we believe that Christ is our light and hope. It was fitting for Germans to use evergreens and wreaths to remind them of Jesus' coming into our hearts.

The Advent wreath originated with a minister who used it as a calendar. The original wreath would consist of red candles and twenty white candles to count the days down. In most of the Catholic world, the candles consist of purple, pink, and sometimes white. In Germany,



however, the wreath is still adorned with red candles as it has been for centuries.
