# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK...

#### DEAR FRIENDS.

The question of the return of the Lord has held the attention of believers from the beginning of the Church. As a response to it, Christians have adopted different attitudes; the two major are: being idle (unruly) while waiting for the imminent return of the Lord, and secondly, living under constant fear of the unknown. With regards to the first attitude, Saint Paul is very clear in his exhortation to the Thessalonians who thought that there was no reason either to work or even to proclaim the gospel because of the Lord's imminent return. Says Paul, "If a man will not work, he shall not eat. We hear that some among you are idle. They are not busy; they are busybodies. Such people we command and urge in the Lord Jesus Christ to settle down and earn the bread they eat" (2 Thessalonians 3:10). The second attitude is the one that makes us live under constant fear of the return of the Lord.

Today's readings give us another understanding of the matter. While the two examples in the gospel set in front of us the idea of possibility or probability with the return of the master of the house and the thief, Jesus' return is an assurance, because for him the question is not about if he will come but when he will come. That is the reason we are called to be alert not under fear of uncertainty but in the grace of the Lord that enables us to remain vigilant and alert.

The people of Thessalonica were waiting for the return of the Lord. For them, there was nothing to do because they would share in eternal life. Salvation for them was something they understood as totally granted. They took it for granted because they could not imagine any of them being left. This same line of thought is the one that characterizes our common mentality, habit, and culture today. We have bought into the notion that we are all getting to heaven in the end anyway, no matter how bad we have been. Once we accept such line of thought, we let the devil win because we will no longer worry about things such as prayer, obeying the commandments and living a morally good life. In today's gospel reading, Jesus tells us that heaven is not something we should take for granted. It is not automatic. Rather, heaven is something we have to work for and be prepared for. And because we do not know when the end will come for any one of us, we have to always be watching; meaning that we ought to keep ourselves in right relation with God, using self-discipline to avoid laziness in our service of the Lord. This is where faith comes to the play.

As a matter of fact, faith is the key to our process of being prepared. However, as we hear from the second reading, faith is not just to claim that we believe, or I believe. Like Abraham, our faith should make us respond with obedience to God's call for action. Jesus is crystal clear on this matter. He says, "Not everyone who says to me, "Lord, Lord," will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven" (Matthew 7:21-23). Faith should always lead us to action. This is the challenge we are called to face as we strive to keep watch and remain alert, as we wait for the return of the Lord.

And let us continue to pray for one another and for our parish family.

### **QUERIDOS AMIGOS,**

La cuestión del regreso del Señor ha ocupado la atención de los creyentes desde el comienzo de la Iglesia. Como respuesta a ella, los cristianos han adoptado diferentes actitudes; los dos principales son: estar ocioso (ingobernable) mientras se espera el regreso inminente del Señor, y en segundo lugar, vivir bajo el temor constante de lo desconocido. En cuanto a la primera actitud, san Pablo es muy claro en su exhortación a los tesalonicenses que pensaban que no había motivo ni para trabajar ni para anunciar el evangelio ante la inminencia del regreso del Señor. Pablo dice: "Si alguno no quiere trabajar, no coma. Oímos que algunos de vosotros están ociosos. No están ocupados; son entrometidos. A tales personas les mandamos y exhortamos en el Señor Jesucristo a que se establezcan y ganen el pan que comen" (2 Tesalonicenses 3:10). La segunda actitud es la que nos hace vivir bajo el temor constante del regreso del Señor.

Las lecturas de hoy nos dan otra comprensión del asunto. Si bien los dos ejemplos en el evangelio nos ponen frente a nosotros la idea de posibilidad o probabilidad con el regreso del dueño de la casa y el ladrón, el regreso de Jesús es una seguridad, porque para él la pregunta no es si vendrá o no. pero cuando vendrá. Por eso estamos llamados a estar alerta no bajo el miedo a la incertidumbre sino en la gracia del Señor que nos permite permanecer vigilantes y alertas.

El pueblo de Tesalónica estaba esperando el regreso del Señor. Para ellos no había nada que hacer porque participarían de la vida eterna. La salvación para ellos era algo que entendían como totalmente concedido. Lo dieron por sentado porque no podían imaginar que ninguno de ellos quedara. Esta misma línea de pensamiento es la que caracteriza nuestra mentalidad, hábito y cultura comunes hoy. Hemos comprado la noción de que todos vamos a llegar al cielo al final de todos modos, no importa lo mal que hayamos sido. Una vez que aceptamos tal línea de pensamiento, dejamos que el diablo gane porque ya no nos preocuparemos por cosas como la oración, obedecer los mandamientos y vivir una vida moralmente buena. En la lectura del evangelio de hoy, Jesús nos dice que el cielo no es algo que debamos dar por sentado. No es automático. Más bien, el cielo es algo por lo que tenemos que trabajar y estar preparados. Y como no sabemos cuándo llegará el final para ninguno de nosotros, tenemos que estar siempre vigilantes; lo que significa que debemos mantenernos en una relación correcta con Dios, usando la autodisciplina para evitar la pereza en nuestro servicio al Señor. Aquí es donde la fe entra en juego.

De hecho, la fe es la clave de nuestro proceso de preparación. Sin embargo, como escuchamos en la segunda lectura, la fe no es solo afirmar que creemos o creo. Como Abraham, nuestra fe debe hacernos responder con obediencia al llamado de Dios a la acción. Jesús es muy claro en este asunto. Él dice: "No todo el que me dice: Señor, Señor, entrará en el reino de los cielos, sino el que hace la voluntad de mi Padre que está en los cielos" (Mateo 7:21-23). La fe siempre debe llevarnos a la acción. Este es el desafío que estamos llamados a enfrentar mientras nos esforzamos por velar y permanecer alerta, mientras esperamos el regreso del Señor. Y sigamos orando unos por otros y por nuestra familia parroquial.

## READINGS

#### **FIRST READING**

#### WIS 18:6-9

The night of the passover was known beforehand to our fathers, that, with sure knowledge of the oaths in which they put their faith, they might have courage. Your people awaited the salvation of the just and the destruction of their foes. For when you punished our adversaries, in this you glorified us whom you had summoned. For in secret the holy children of the good were offering sacrifice and putting into effect with one accord the divine institution.

#### **SECOND READING** HEB 11:1-2, 8-19

Brothers and sisters: Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen. Because of it the ancients were well attested. By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; he went out, not knowing where he was to go. By faith he sojourned in the promised land as in a foreign country, dwelling in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs of the same promise; for he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and maker is God. By faith he received power to generate, even though he was past the normal age —and Sarah herself was sterile— for he thought that the one who had made the promise was trustworthy. So it was that there came forth from one man, himself as good as dead, descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sands on the seashore. All these died in faith. They did not receive what had been promised but saw it and greeted it from afar and acknowledged themselves to be strangers and aliens on earth, for those who speak thus show that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of the land from which they had come, they would have had opportunity to return. But now they desire a better homeland, a heavenly one. Therefore, God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared a city for them. By faith Abraham, when put to the test, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was ready to offer his only son, of whom it was said, "Through Isaac descendants shall bear your name." He reasoned that God was able to raise even from the dead, and he received Isaac back as a symbol.

#### **GOSPEL READING** LK 12:32-48

Jesus said to his disciples: "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom. Sell your belongings and give alms. Provide money bags for yourselves that do not wear out, an inexhaustible treasure in heaven that no thief can reach nor moth destroy. For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be. "Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants who await their master's return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival. Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself, have them recline at table, and proceed to wait on them. And should he come in the second or third watch and find them prepared in this way, blessed are those servants. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour when the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." Then Peter said, "Lord, is this parable meant for us or for everyone?" And the Lord replied, "Who, then, is the faithful and prudent steward whom the master will put in charge of his servants to distribute the food allowance at the proper time? Blessed is that servant whom his master on arrival finds doing so. Truly, I say to you, the master will put the servant in charge of all his property. But if that servant says to himself, 'My master is delayed in coming,' and begins to beat the menservants and the maidservants, to eat and drink and get drunk, then that servant's master will come on an unexpected day and at an unknown hour and will punish the servant severely and assign him a place with the unfaithful. That servant who knew his master's will but did not make preparations nor act in accord with his will shall be beaten severely; and the servant who was ignorant of his master's will but acted in a way deserving of a severe beating shall be beaten only lightly. Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more."
