FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK...

DEAR FRIENDS,

The question about "who will be saved" has always been in the lips of Christians. Today, Jesus invites us to consider the question under two different aspects. The question he is asked presupposes something that is already taken for granted. The Jews do not ask him "who will be saved," but "will only a few be saved"? This is because for them, it is granted that they are the only ones to be saved, not the Gentiles.

When we look around us, we will find the same feeling and assurance. We take it for granted that salvation is something we already have in our pockets. Now the question we ask is that of the number. Interestingly, Jesus does not respond to that question. I would say, his response to the Jews and to all of us who take salvation for granted, is "slow down; not that fast..."

To begin with, Jesus' answer brings to light another truth the Jews were not ready to hear and to listen; that all are called to salvation. In other words, Jesus tells us that God offers and makes salvation available everyone who is willing to upon up to his grace. Jesus insists that "belonging" to the chosen people is not a guarantee of salvation. There is much more into that. For people will come from afar and will recline at the table of the Lord. So Jesus refuses to give an answer that could either encourage his listeners to just be complacent by taking salvation for granted, or to be discouraged because they would think there is nothing to do. That is why Jesus insists on "striving to enter through the narrow gate."

From there on, we are reminded of a very important truth, namely that we all have to work hard to enter into the kingdom. We cannot take it for granted. Neither can't we think we are entitled to it, no matter who we are or to what group we belong. So, to say the least, this is a warning for all and everyone of us. We are reminded not to take salvation for granted. Rather, we need to work for it, not as if we were buying it but because we have to respond to the call. The kingdom is at hands, and it is up to us to respond to the call to be a part of it or not. To work for the kingdom is to strive to go through the narrow gate, because only the narrow gate will lead us to eternal life.

The word Jesus uses is so revealing here: to strive. In Greek the word is agonizomai. We can hear the word agony as we read this Greek word. So, the word reminds us of the requirement to carry our cross to follow Jesus. The agony we are invited to experience to be saved is to fight against our selfishness and pride, when we either look down on others, or we exclude them from our love and mercy, or when we consider them as outcast or not belonging. We are called to follow and to keep the Commandments. So, today you and I are called to look at ourselves with honesty and see where we stand with regards to our understanding of what salvation requires from us. Is it enough for us to just claim salvation because we belong to the Church, the bride of the Lord? How do we work for the kingdom and to respond to the salvation God freely offers us? Do not we spend our time asking the question about how many will be saved rather than finding ways to work to embrace God's salvation? Where and in what situation have I refused to strive (embrace agony) by choosing the wide-open gate rather than the narrow one?

Let us make this opportunity the Lord is offering beneficial as we strive to enter though the narrow gate, and let us continue to pray for one another and for our parish family.

QUERIDOS AMIGOS,

La pregunta sobre "quién se salvará" siempre ha estado en los labios de los cristianos. Hoy, Jesús nos invita a considerar la cuestión bajo dos aspectos diferentes. La pregunta que se le hace presupone algo que ya se da por sentado. Los judíos no le preguntan "quién se salvará", sino "¿serán salvos unos pocos"? Esto se debe a que a ellos se les concede que son los únicos que se salvarán, no los gentiles.

Cuando miramos a nuestro alrededor, encontraremos el mismo sentimiento y seguridad. Damos por sentado que la salvación es algo que ya tenemos en nuestros bolsillos. Ahora la pregunta que nos hacemos es la del número. Curiosamente, Jesús no responde a esa pregunta. Diría que su respuesta a los judíos ya todos nosotros que damos por sentada la salvación es "reduzca la velocidad; no tan rapido..." Para empezar, la respuesta de Jesús saca a la luz otra verdad que los judíos no estaban preparados para oír y escuchar; que todos están llamados a la salvación. En otras palabras, Jesús nos dice que Dios ofrece y pone la salvación al alcance de todos los que están dispuestos a depender de su gracia. Jesús insiste en que la "pertenencia" al pueblo elegido no es garantía de salvación. Hay mucho más en eso. Porque vendrá gente de lejos y se sentará a la mesa del Señor. Entonces, Jesús se niega a dar una respuesta que podría alentar a sus oyentes a ser complacientes al dar por sentada la salvación, o a desanimarse porque pensarían que no hay nada que hacer. Por eso Jesús insiste en "esforzarse por entrar por la puerta estrecha".

A partir de ahí, se nos recuerda una verdad muy importante, a saber, que todos tenemos que trabajar duro para entrar en el reino. No podemos darlo por sentado. Tampoco podemos pensar que tenemos derecho a ella, sin importar quiénes seamos o a qué grupo pertenezcamos. Entonces, por decir lo menos, esta es una advertencia para todos y cada uno de nosotros. Se nos recuerda que no demos por sentada la salvación. Más bien, necesitamos trabajar por ello, no como si lo estuviéramos comprando sino porque tenemos que responder a la llamada. El reino está cerca y depende de nosotros responder al llamado de ser parte de él o no. Trabajar por el reino es esforzarse por pasar por la puerta estrecha, porque sólo la puerta estrecha nos llevará a la vida eterna.

La palabra que usa Jesús es muy reveladora aquí: esforzarse. En griego la palabra es agonizomai. Podemos escuchar la palabra agonía mientras leemos esta palabra griega. Entonces, la palabra nos recuerda el requisito de llevar nuestra cruz para seguir a Jesús. La agonía que estamos invitados a experimentar para ser salvos es luchar contra nuestro egoísmo y orgullo, cuando despreciamos a los demás, o los excluimos de nuestro amor y misericordia, o cuando los consideramos marginados o no pertenecientes. Estamos llamados a seguir y guardar los Mandamientos. Entonces, hoy tú y yo estamos llamados a mirarnos a nosotros mismos con honestidad y ver dónde nos encontramos con respecto a nuestra comprensión de lo que la salvación requiere de nosotros. ¿Es suficiente para nosotros simplemente reclamar la salvación porque pertenecemos a la Iglesia, la novia del Señor? ¿Cómo trabajamos por el reino y para responder a la salvación que Dios nos ofrece gratuitamente? ¿No pasamos nuestro tiempo haciéndonos la pregunta de cuántos se salvarán en lugar de encontrar formas de trabajar para abrazar la salvación de Dios? ¿Dónde y en qué situación me he negado a esforzarme (abrazar la agonía) eligiendo la puerta abierta de par en par en lugar de la estrecha? Hagamos que esta oportunidad que el Señor ofrece sea beneficiosa mientras nos esforzamos por entrar por la puerta estrecha, y sigamos orando unos por otros y por nuestra familia parroquial.

Thus says the LORD: I know their works and their thoughts, and I come to gather nations of every language; they shall come and see my glory. I will set a sign among them; from them I will send fugitives to the nations: to Tarshish, Put and Lud, Mosoch, Tubal and Javan, to the distant coastlands that have never heard of my fame, or seen my glory; and they shall proclaim my glory among the nations. Endure your trials as "discipline"; God treats you as sons. For what "son" is there whom his father does not discipline? At the time, all discipline seems a cause not for joy but for pain, yet later it brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it. So strengthen your drooping hands and your weak knees. Make straight paths for your feet, that what is lame may not be disjointed but healed.

NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL 2024

28 Q. Why did Jesus Christ institute the Most Holy Eucharist?

A. Jesus Christ instituted the Most Holy Eucharist for three principal reasons: (1) To be the Sacrifice of the New Law; (2) To be the food of our souls; (3) To be a perpetual memorial of His passion and death and a precious pledge both of His love for us and of eternal life.

29 Q. Why did Jesus Christ institute this sacrament under the appearances of bread and wine?

A. Jesus Christ instituted this sacrament under the appearances of bread and wine, because, the Eucharist being intended to be our spiritual nourishment, it was therefore fitting that it should be given to us under the form of food and drink.

30 Q. What are the effects which the Most Holy Eucharist produces in us?

A. The principal effects which the Most Holy Eucharist produces in those who worthily receive it are these: (1) It preserves and increases the life of the soul, which is grace, just as natural food sustains and increases the life of the body; (2) It remits venial sins and preserves us from mortal sin; (3) It produces spiritual consolation.
