Many of our seniors don't have computers, or if they have registered for the vaccine online they never received a call for an appointment. Director of St. Anne Community Outreach Katie Byers and St. Anne Church Director of Stewardship Kimberly Kaup are doing their best to help gather the most current information in an effort to assist our seniors get registered for the vaccine online. **I'm not sure we can be miracle workers, but there has to be some way we can help our senior citizens at least get in the line to receive the vaccine.** If you are in this situation please call the Parish Office and ask for Kimberly. She will give you the most up-to-date information we can find and she will do her best to either direct you to the best place to get the vaccine or help you if you have to register using a computer.

### On Our Campus

- Last week our maintenance crew cleared the leaves off the roofs of our many buildings and cleaned all the gutters. This was no small task! This is the type of preventative maintenance that was lacking on our campus before Maintenance Director Travis Harris arrived.
- Because a paving crew from North Carolina had extra asphalt which they had to get rid of for a nominal fee, Travis directed them to pave in front of the weight room and Deimel Field entrance. We have been having standing water problems in those areas for a while and this should fix the problems.
- The bell company arrived and once again fixed the motor on the main church bell tower. Those motors are 20 years old and we are hoping that this fix will solve the problem. If it does not we will be looking at a rather expensive motor replacement.
- We continue to wait for bids on our Early Learning Center, the last project of our Capital Campaign. Travis is in conversation with Architectural Engineer Ron Stotser in hopes of moving this project forward.
- As I type this, our school is coming back to on-campus learning. I've missed the little ones and I am so glad they can safely return to in-person instruction. With the Christmas Break followed by two weeks of virtual learning our children have not been in our school buildings for over a month. During that time the entire school has been deep cleaned by our new cleaning company. Many of the floors have been waxed, as well. Over this period the new environmental (HVAC) controls enabled us to lower the set points on all 57 thermostats with the push of one button on a computer screen. They switched back to "occupied" at 6 a.m. January 19th. With this new level of control, which was previously impossible, it's easy to see how we will be able to save significant amounts of money on energy.
- A couple of weeks ago we replaced the roof on the art room extension in the high school. It has been leaking for years. Now Travis can go in and repair the ceiling.

### Really... Three Birthday Cakes?

Once again, you guys over did it. I want to thank you for your birthday greetings, gifts and, yes, three birthday cakes. Throughout the day on my birthday, cakes kept appearing in the Friary garage. No, I didn't eat all of them. They were shared with the faculty and staff of our parish and school. Thank you so much for all of your kindness to me and all the friars. I've never been a big birthday kind of person, but rest assured I am grateful for all of your best wishes.

One of the characteristics of Everyday Stewardship is to be committed – to persevere daily in a way of life acknowledging that everything belongs to God.

I know, I know. Easier said than done.

Just ask Zebedee. It's quite an image we get from the Gospel, after all. "So they left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him."

There was Zebedee, about his business, mending nets with his two sons, who were undoubtedly his best workers – they had to have been more dedicated than the hired men, who worked for wages rather than for family. And in an instant off they go, following this strange man.

I don't know about you, but if my kids left me on a hot summer day to finish the lawn by myself, I wouldn't be too happy.

But Zebedee must have been someone quite special. Perhaps he realized that his sons didn't belong to him – not really. They belonged to God, and from the beginning of time, it had been appointed that they would be among the first disciples of Christ. He passed, he called, they followed, and Zebedee obliged. He simply went back to mending his nets, I imagine.

Zebedee already understood what St. Teresa of Calcutta would say millennia later: "Give until it hurts."

"You're wasting my time." "I've done so much for her; she owes me this." How often do we think things, and even people and relationships, belong to us? The truth is none of them do. We must be ready, as Zebedee was, to surrender them to God when He comes walking past.

## GOSPEL MEDITATION

It was a normal day by all accounts, but John just wasn't feeling himself. He was a little lightheaded and out of sorts. Later in the afternoon, he experienced a sharp pain in his chest and arm. Quick thinking and action brought John to the emergency department with a diagnosis of a significant heart attack. Surviving this ordeal, he found himself face to face with his cardiologist, having an honest conversation about things that needed to change. "I came close to death," John found himself thinking. Then came the remorse. He was a young man with a loving wife and children who were very close to facing life without him. John found himself with intense sorrow for living an unchecked and self-indulgent life that almost brought him to his demise. He wanted to change.

We all have our wake-up calls. We have experiences and encounters that force us to really think twice about choices we have made and directions we have taken. Often, we find ourselves looking at those we have hurt square in the eye and wallowing in our foolishness. We regrettably realize that we have allowed our needs to lure us into making some cruel mistakes. We impulsively say things and flippantly do things that reveal our unredeemed and unhealed self. It is a self we stumble over and try to tame but can't quite seem to master and control. Help!

We spin our wheels, naively thinking that we will somehow, perhaps through persistence, get ourselves unstuck. But, we don't. We just get out of the car, feeling very helpless, and ignorantly look at the mess we got ourselves into. Did we ever think to ask someone for help? Or, taken the advice of One who is wiser and avoid this route altogether? "Come after me," are words that Jesus says to all of us. In order to heed his invitation, we must leave our ego-self behind and follow.

When we really see and understand the freedom, peace, justice, and love he offers, we find ourselves with such sorrow in our hearts for how foolish and silly we have been. All the misguided choices and sinful actions come full view and we see how risky our random impassioned behaviors really have been. Repentance is beautiful. When done with a sincere and contrite heart, it directs us to the glory that can be ours, ignites us with the challenge of living a life in service of others and reminds us that all is well. ©LPi




