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PAUL CARUSO NAMED 2022 ST. DISMAS AWARD RECIPIENT



The Board of Directors of Dismas Ministry, Inc. is pleased to announce the recipient of the 2022 St. Dismas Award. Paul Caruso will be presented with the award in spring 2022 at a special event in suburban Atlanta, GA.

Caruso has served the incarcerated and indigent for over 32 years, and currently is the leader of the St. Joseph Cafasso Prison Ministries in Georgia, which he founded in 1999. Caruso has said that inmates, though often "treated like lepers," are in fact "chil-

dren of God," and that "conversion of hearts" is his main mission.

Visiting both men's and women's prisons, Caruso and his team of 20 volunteers conduct weekly communion services, catechism classes, and faith discussions, as well as RCIA with an attending deacon. He and his team also visit inmates in solitary confinement and have witnessed many conversions even there. Caruso has been present at over 150 baptisms and confirmations during his time in prison ministry.

In the recommendation from the award committee, Board Member Joshua Stancil stated: "The committee was particularly struck by Paul's response to a life-threatening battle with COVID earlier this year. At 78 years of age, Paul was quite vulnerable to the virus, and spent nearly two months on a ventilator, in a coma. He has since recovered, and recently met with the Archdiocese of Atlanta to assume responsibility for three more prisons."

Throughout more than three decades in prison ministry, Caruso estimates he has served nearly 40,000 people.

"In all my life, I have never seen a humble 'servant of God' like Paul, who serves as effectively as he does. He has taught me so much about my faith, and how to serve others. All on his volunteer team feel deeply about Paul and his ministry that he performs humbly and selflessly," said Kevin Reidy, a prison minister who nominated Caruso for the award.

SMALL FAITH COMMUNITIES AT ST. THOMAS AQUINAS

Remember the popular television show "Cheers"? Its opening song went like this:

Sometimes you want to go Where everybody knows your name, and they're always glad you came. You wanna be where you can see, our troubles are all the same You wanna be where everybody knows Your name.

That song is a great description of a Small Faith Community. People who were once strangers come together, get to know one another and, before long, become friends. They know they are accepted as they are and are supported in their struggles as well as their joys.

What is a Small Faith Community?

A Small Faith Community (sometimes called a Small Christian Community, a Small Church Community, or in Spanish, Comunidad de base) is a group of 8-12 adults who gather together to share their life experiences and to grow in their faith. A Small Faith Community is a smaller, more intimate experience of church. Small Faith Communities provide a safe place where you can be open and honest.

Who is invited to join a SFC?

You are invited to be part of this exciting and enriching model of parish life! It's our hope that everyone would be a part of a small faith group.

What are the benefits?

Here are just a few:

- feeling like you belong to the parish
- having the opportunity to be listened to in a trusting and non-judgmental atmosphere
- making the connection between what we believe—what we celebrate at Mass—and your own life
- having your abilities and talents encouraged and appreciated
- feeling supported during trying times and sharing joys during the happy times
- deepening your faith and your relationship with Jesus Christ
- finding ways to serve the parish and the wider community as an individual and as a group

What is the importance of joining a SFC today?

Catholic parishes are meant to foster an experience of love and an experience of faith. In a large parish like St. Thomas Aquinas, that can be a challenge. Among so many, it is easy to feel isolated and alone, especially during a pandemic. Gathering in Small Faith Communities allows the church to become smaller and more intimate. These communities offer what everyone desires: the experience of being known and being loved. SFCs also offer an experience of faith. We all have faith, but most of us need help from others to learn to trust the faith within us and learn to recognize and describe our experience of faith. The more our experiences of faith and love are shared—and this can only happen in a small group—the more we notice God and God's call to be church for one another. SFCs enable us to be who we are the loved and cherished faith-filled people of God.

What is faith sharing?

It is the simple sharing of our experience that gives us the opportunity to reflect on and recognize God's activity and presence in our daily lives.

What about the programs used by the groups?

Groups begin with Come as You Are, a 12 session program that is an invitation to slow down and become more reflective about life. It helps people connect with one another beyond the usual "news, weather, and sports" conversations so that they will want to stay together and go beyond this introductory program.

... Anytime I have a challenge, I have this group of people that I can just e-mail [and ask them to pray for me] and they can e-mail me and say, "Pray for me." ...Also, it is great to share the joys in our lives.It's true joy looking around and seeing the faces of people who are happy for you. I love the way that our small faith group comes together to serve others.

 I love my small faith group because it has allowed me to have a safe place where there is no condemnation or judgment of anything I share...only love and encouragement.

How do Small Faith Communities remain connected to the parish?

Each group has a leader who keeps the community connected to the parish just as the pastor is the connector to the diocesan church and the bishop is the connector to the Pope and the universal church.



Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.



Why Do We Bless Ourselves with Holy Water upon Entering the Worship Space?

Upon entering the worship space, we usually dip our hand into the baptismal font and bless ourselves with the Sign of the Cross. "In the name of the Father, and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Amen."

At our Baptism, the priest or deacon either poured water or immersed us three times, while stating, "[Name], I baptize you, in the name of the Father [dip], and of the Son [dip], and of the Holy Spirit [dip]." Baptism made us Christians. This holy water cleanses, renews, and refreshes us along our Christian journey. The Sign of the Cross is a mark of the One to whom we belong—to whom we are conformed—the Triune God who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Having been washed, renewed, and conformed to the image of God, the newly baptized is now a Christian.

By dipping our hand into the holy water, we renew our baptismal covenant. We participate in the life of the one who calls us to a life of discipleship, whereby we carry forth the mission of Christ by renewing the face of the earth. It is in these baptismal waters that one journeys to the eucharistic table, where we renew our baptismal covenant each Sunday. We also pass these waters on our way out of the worship space as we take leave of one another in order to live the mission of Christ as faithful disciples.

It is for this reason of renewing our baptismal covenant that the placement of the baptismal font is typically close to the entrance of the worship space or in the narthex. Just as one enters the Christian faith through Baptism, so, too, do we enter the church by renewing our entrance into the Church. Some communities have built or renovated their worship spaces to make a place for a large font. Such fonts signify the lavish and flowing love of God for his people. Some older churches have little dishes of holy water—taken from the font—by other doors than the main entrance. While these are convenient, we are invited to enter the worship space through the main doors, walking to the font, dipping our hand in holy water, signing ourselves in the Sign of the Cross, and processing in our entrance journey to reunite ourselves to the Sunday assembly. The font is the place of Baptism and has pride of place in our worship spaces.


The blessing of baptismal water contains rich imagery. It states, "By the power of the Holy Spirit give to this water the grace of your Son, so that in the sacrament of baptism all those whom you have created in your likeness may be cleansed from sin and rise to a new birth of innocence by water and the Holy Spirit" (*Rite of Baptism for Children*, 91). The three persons of Divine Mystery work through baptismal waters to refresh and renew us in our call to carry out Christ's mission in the world. ◆
