

Father Pat's Gospel Reflection

What should I do for Lent? Should I give up candy, cigarettes, or television? Should I go to Mass every day? Do I go to Confession during Lent? These questions run through our mind as we begin Lent. Scripture at times calls us to look at our perspective on life. Are they in-tune with the Gospel message of Jesus? As we begin Lent, our penance may involve doing something such as joining a Church organization like The Saint Vincent de Paul Society, the Knights of Columbus or the Council of Catholic Women, rather than give something up.

During this Season of Lent, both John the Baptist as well as Jesus Christ call us to repent. Is it a call to give something up? Is it a call to start something new? It could be a little of both. Either way we seek to turn away from sin and come closer to the Lord. When we repent it should be on a regular basis, like at least four times a year during Christmas, Easter, summer, and fall. In this way, we receive the graces of the Sacrament of Confession or Reconciliation, and grow in our relationship with the Lord.

In the book of Deuteronomy, Moses tells the people how to come closer to God. He tells them to offer the first fruits of their labor to the Lord. Moses also tells the Israelites that once they arrived in the Promised Land and become successful, they are not to forget how they are still totally dependent on God. They must also remember that they have not always been blessed. They were once wonderers and slaves. It was God who called them and made them His chosen people. It was God who was there to guide and protect them.

Moses also prescribes that the people celebrate their blessing with the Levite priests and the aliens in their midst. They must remember that they were once aliens in Egypt. This is why they must never forget the aliens in their celebration. The blessings they have received from the Lord are also to be shared with the less fortunate. They would be protected by God as long as they kept His commandments and teachings. They would always have a special bond with God as long as they kept God's will.

In the Gospel, we see how Jesus is also loyal to His Father. He is led into the desert by the Spirit for forty days to prepare for His public ministry. During this time, He fasts and prays so that He can better understand God's plan for Him. During those forty days in the desert without food, Jesus is tired, hungry and vulnerable. Because Jesus was filled with the Holy Spirit, He overcame His temptation to give in to His personal needs. His first temptation was to turn stones into bread and satisfy his physical hunger. There is nothing wrong with eating and drinking when you are hungry and thirsty, but Jesus was tempted to use his power for selfish reasons to serve Himself. Jesus knew that His power was only to be used to serve God and His kingdom.

Jesus' second and third temptation were very similar. His second temptation was to win political power and personal glory. It seemed rational because Jesus could establish God's kingdom quickly and efficiently, but the price would be to sell out His loyalty to God. His third temptation was to use His power to put on a spectacular show leaving the crowd speechless. He was tempted to throw Himself off the top of the temple or parapet and the angels would save Him from hitting the ground. In short, Jesus is to use His heavenly power not for Himself but to serve God and the heavenly kingdom.

The Judean desert was the setting for Jesus in the desert. Like most deserts, it is hot, dry, beautiful, desolate, harsh, empty, lonely, and unforgiving. Winds whip the sand into constantly changing landscapes. It's a place where one's fears easily emerge. There is a fear of heights, darkness, hunger, thirst, loneliness, being lost, and fear of powerlessness. People live in survival mode. It is a place where you are utterly alone and extremely vulnerable.

Most of us have probably experienced a desert experience in our lifetime. For me it is when I made an eight day Ignatian Spiritual Retreat in Grand Coteau Louisiana. It was a silent retreat. You could not speak to anyone except your spiritual advisor, who gives you a biblical passage to reflect on that day. You are all alone. You cannot watch television or have any other form of communication. You had to prepare your own food. It was a lonely experience. It was the longest eight days I ever experienced. To be honest, I was glad when it was over. It was a time to meditate, contemplate, and pray to the Lord. It helps you to better understand what Jesus went through during his forty days in the desert. During that time you grow in faith and surrender to God.

St. Paul tells us that is exactly what we are called to do. We surrender to Jesus in confidence as Jesus surrendered to His Father when He was in the desert. We respond to God's will. This helps us to grow in faith to hear Jesus' teaching and put His words into action by serving God and those around us. This leads to salvation for all of us who seek to grow closer to God. Jesus' salvation for us is universal.. It is not restricted to God's chosen people.

With the Eucharist, we reject the world's promise of cheap salvation like fame, fortune and power. We turn to the Lord of all and pray for the grace to allow the Lord into our lives. Jesus fills our lives with His strength. The strength Jesus provides is the strength of the Holy Spirit. It is the same Holy Spirit that led Jesus into the desert. It is the same Spirit that guides us in our personal desert experiences of life and helps us overcome all the temptations in life. With the Spirit's help we can overcome all temptations of life. With the help of the Spirit we can do the impossible.



STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The Stations of the Cross devotion for Lent begins the first Friday after Ash Wednesday. This year it begins on March 7th and ends Good Friday, April 18. Spanish is offered at 6:00 pm and English is offered at 7:00 pm.

On Good Friday, Live Stations of the Cross will be offered at 11:00 am, 6:00pm, and 7:00pm with veneration of the cross at 3:00pm.

TEACHERS NEEDED


Farewell from Joyce Thorpe




