

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's first reading is part of the story of God's call to the prophet Jeremiah. The reading is from Jeremiah 1:4-5, however if you continue reading up to verse 8, you will read that at the time he is called to be a

prophet, Jeremiah is a very young man. He tells God that he is too young to be a prophet (verse 6). He doesn't have enough experience. He doesn't know what to say and no one will pay attention to such a young person anyway. But God will have none of it. He assures Jeremiah that he is being chosen by God Himself and that He will give him the words to speak (verse 7). God will put him in front of the most powerful people in the land and make him strong in their presence (verse 8).

And that is what happened. Jeremiah stood up to all the civil and religious leaders of his day and confronted them about their injustices. He suffered mightily because of it. He was frequently beaten and thrown into jail. Once, he was thrown in an empty well. But God remained with him through it all, and every word Jeremiah spoke came to pass. None of us remembers who the king was at the time or the name of the high priest or other powerful officials of that time, but we do remember Jeremiah.

As a people of faith, we are called like Jeremiah to speak up for the truth. It is not our truth but God's truth. It is the truth as it has been revealed to us in God's Word and preserved down through the centuries, in a Church that Jesus established. In baptism, all of us received an anointing that made us prophets. Remember, we are baptized Priest, Prophet and King. We are empowered by God to speak the truth, even when it is inconvenient. It is a job for each and every one of us.

What makes our testimony powerful is not just the truth of our words. Rather, it is the love with which we speak. Saint Paul tells us in today's second reading, "If I speak in human and angelic tongues, but do not have love, I am a resounding gong or a clashing cymbal." Love is what makes our voices heard and what changes hearts. We are called to love our enemies and pray for our persecutors. If we speak the truth only to gain power over others, we will be no different from those who oppose us. It will just be an exercise in power. But if we speak with love, if we let people know that we want what is best for them, we will change hearts and change behaviors. We can be sure to face opposition and even persecution, but God will be with us through it all and, eventually, the truth will win out.

The past twenty years have been difficult for us as a Church. We have lost much of our standing in the world because of the abuse crisis. Many people refuse to listen to us. The way to gain back their trust, is not by keeping silent, especially in the face of injustice. Rather, the way to regain our standing is by doing what Jesus established His Church to doproclaim His teaching and make disciples of the nations. It is by standing with the poor and the defenseless. It is by speaking the truth in love to the powerful. It is by living the gospel without negotiation in a world that is losing its way. That is something all of us can do. God will be with us as we do it, just as He was with Jeremiah.








Annual Anniversary Mass at St. Jude Catholic Church Boca Raton, FL February 19, 2022 ~ 10:30 AM





In most counties, living in a car is considered being under roof, which means they are way down on a list for housing. Low-income housing lists for most can take years.

The mission of the Care Ministry is to be a channel of God's love by providing solutions to area citizens for the many issues they call for. 


