

Reflection on Sunday's Readings

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Peter, James and John must have been completely baffled and a little irritated at what Jesus asked them to do. Afterall, they were professional

fishermen and they were fishing their home waters. Yet, this carpenter said to go back out and try again. Besides that, they fished at night because that's when it is the best time to fish. Not in broad daylight, no one caught fish in broad daylight.

Not to mention that fishing wasn't easy. For one, they were worn out having spent the entire night rowing and dropping nets, then retrieving the nets and rowing some more. For two, they had just finished cleaning their nets. It was time to get something to eat and go to bed to be ready for the next night.

What Jesus asked them to do just didn't make sense and the three of them, it's easy to suspect, had little enthusiasm for the idea. I imagine that Jesus tried not to chuckle as He watched all three stare at each other totally confused at the suggestion (He knew what was coming next). Then Peter, speaking for the other two, says 'OK I'll do it'. The other two say nothing, which makes you wonder what they were thinking. But then, they nearly sink their boats bringing the catch to shore.

Certainly, life can be perplexing. Life is always challenging and, often enough, scarry (did you catch the part where Jesus tells Peter to not be afraid?). We can think we know how best to handle a circumstance or make a solid decision. But the better way is to do what St. Peter did: listen and then say yes to whatever He tells you.

God knows what He is about. Just as Jesus knew what would happen when He encouraged His three friends to go back out and try again. My observation is that God always has something much better, much more abundant in mind for us than we imagine... always.

So how do we know when God tells us what we should do? Start with prayer and ask for direction. The way ahead comes in different ways. Often someone will say or do something, and you know you have the answer. Sometimes an idea or insight comes to mind. Situations can change and problems are solved. And God communicating to us more directly is not reserved for Saints of the Church. In any case the first, best step is to go to God. And go to Him with belief that He has a way for you. Jesus picked 12 very unlikely men to anchor His Church. Then, before He retuned to heaven, He entrusted the whole enterprise to us, His daughters and sons. Why? Because He believes in us. He believes in you. Believe in the God who believes in you.

We, as Catholics, believe that Jesus lives within us. As a child, they may picture an image of Jesus similar to the one above flowing through their hearts and minds. As adults, we may imagine Him as comforting spiritual energy flowing through us much in the same way. Nonetheless, as believers, we (feel) different knowing that He is in us. The He is the Holy Spirit, and we should seek to absorb more of Him and emulate Him in everything we do.

Or do we??

Consider for a moment, how many times in your life is it possible that He has called you and you missed Him, ignored Him, or worse yet, rejected Him? It could've been turning down a request to teach Sunday school. It could've been turning away from the homeless or a drug addict who made you too uncomfortable to even look at. Hebrews 11:6



Thanks to everyone who attended and helped at our Chapter Meeting. We had a good turnout, it was very informative, and it was great to see everyone again


