Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time - July 11, 2021



There is something very moving about this gospel passage of Jesus sending out twelve ordinary men, after a brief apprenticeship, to preach the message of God's word, which they did not fully understand. They were to have a simple lifestyle, to be poor as he was poor and not to worry too much about their physical needs, nor become upset if their message was not welcome at every door. It was no surprise that their mission was highly successful. The secret of their fruitfulness was that they benefitted from the living example of Jesus and the time in his company.

The sending out of the twelve apostles was but the beginning of the church's mission to the world. Down the centuries ordinary people have been called in the same way, to win souls for Christ and to gather them into his church. If the word of God is to reach all people then everyone who hears it must make it known. The Good News of salvation is not intended to be guarded jealously but to be spread around and handed down. Every baptized Christian is called to accomplish this work of spreading the gospel. The message of salvation is offered to all but it is not forced on anyone, for it is a personal choice to accept or reject the call of God. Today we have the privilege of responding to Christ's invitation to be fruitful bearers of his Good News. Becoming a servant of God in a society where selfishness is part of the foundation structure, is indeed a tall order. This invitation to a more dedicated life is very challenging and demands that we have a caring heart. Many of us are left with the feeling that we have nothing much to offer to the furthering of his kingdom. Parents should remember that one of the most effective proclamations of the gospel can be carried out without going over their own doorsteps: by rearing their children in the faith and upholding Christian values in their homes. This is work all families can do, and it involves no small effort.

Another effective way of proclaiming the gospel is by the silent witness of a simple life-style. Many of us clutter our hearts and minds with worldly goods, which prevent us from attending to what is most important in life. So much of what we accumulate in life is left unused and wasted. We forget that the only luggage we can take with us as we leave this world is charity. Christ's work demands total commitment in small things done daily. He wants all of us to be part of his savings mission. We and his hands by the work we do, his tongue by the words we speak, and his feet by the places and people we visit.

God the Father has invited us to be his ministers, to spread the Good News of the gospel. We pray now for the grace to recognize the dignity of our mission and the necessary strength to carry it out.

How Long Does It Take to Believe?



Some Scriptures are very challenging to apply. The words of Jesus, especially those to do with our faith and belief, seem out of reach to us in practice. Here are some examples:

"If you ask anything of me in my name I will do it." (John 14:14)

"Amen, I say to you, whoever says to this mountain, 'Be lifted up and thrown into the sea,' and does not doubt in his heart but believes that what he says will happen, it shall be done for him." (Mark 11:23)

<u>"Since childhood.</u> It has often thrown him into fire and into water to kill him. But if you can do anything, have compassion on us and help us." Jesus said to him, "'If you can!' Everything is possible to one who has faith." Then the boy's father cried out, "I do believe, help my unbelief!"

In the last example, the father of the afflicted boy had the same problem we do. He desperately wanted deliverance for his son but doubted that Jesus could and would do it. There are a few more scriptures that add details to the way we should pray and believe.

"And we have this confidence in him, that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. And if we know that he hears us...we know that what we have asked him for is ours." (1 John 5:14-15)

"If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you." (John 15:7)

"But if any of you lacks wisdom,* he should ask God who gives to all generously and ungrudgingly, and he will be given it. But he should ask in faith, not doubting, for the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea that is driven and tossed about by the wind. For that person must not suppose that he will receive anything from the Lord, since he is a man of two minds, unstable in all his ways." (James 1:5-8)

So, how do we advance in our faith, to get the place of perfect faith with zero doubt? First of all, God would not instruct us to pray and believe for answers if it were not his intention to provide. Second, if we are instructed to "live by faith" it is clear that we must pray in faith for answers. The problem is the nagging doubt. How do we rid ourselves of it? Oddly enough, by praying in faith about it. "Lord help my unbelief."

As we sense that we are doubting, we stop, cast out the doubt (Get out of my head, NOW!) Resume prayer. If the doubt returns we repeat the command—"Get out!" Our sincerity grows with each attempt at pure faith. God is watching. The last thing is to remember the words of Jesus: "Keep on asking, seeking and knocking." (Matthew 7:7-8) Building implicit and absolute trust is his will. Was any prayer of Jesus ever denied? He knew who he was praying to and his will. So can we. He is our example. "Let it be done for you according to your faith." 

Gospel Meditation

Maybe the work is best left to the professionals. That's how many people view the preaching of the Gospel. That's the stuff priests, religious, deacons, lay ministers, and other professional Church people do. It has little to do with me. Well, that's not really true. The fact of the matter is that preaching the Gospel has everything to do with you, with all of us who are baptized members of the Body of Christ. Nobody gets off the hook from that job. The question is, however, how do we do it? Well, there's a safe way, which many choose, to preach the Gospel — and the risky way. The safe way pretty much keeps the Gospel in church and around like-minded people. I say my prayers, go to Mass, contribute to the food pantry, tithe, and attend Bible Study. That pretty much covers the bases, right? Wrong.

The risky way is the more challenging way and for many, the "road less traveled." Imagine those first disciples going out and into people's homes. They must have had some amazing conversations with folks about God's kingdom, changing their hearts, forgiving sins, and looking at the world differently. They must have met people who were hurting, exiled from their communities, neglected, lost, or living self-insulated lives in a society that served the rich and neglected the poor. While there were many who welcomed what they had to say and the conversations they had, there were others who no doubt rejected them and literally tossed them out on their ears! The Gospel, while being a message of joy and hope, is not always received well by those who are very comfortable keeping things as they are.

The risky way involves example and conversation. We have to take the Gospel from church and carry it with us wherever we go. What kinds of conversations do we have with others? We interact with those closest to us, in our work, social circles, institutions, corporations, in politics, and beyond. Our conversations with others reveal a great deal about how we see things and what we consider important. If we are really interested in seeing God's vision for the world succeed, then we will talk about it. It will become a part of our everyday conversation and find its way into our interactions with others. How will we preserve the dignity of human life and encourage others to have a relationship with God? We must be the example, live value centered, virtuous lives, stand against injustice, combating racism, and learn ways to resolve conflicts without violence.

If we are going to succeed going forward, we have to find a way to bring our prayer centered lives into the marketplace. Our conversations have to change. Not everyone wants to hear what the Gospel has to say. That's a risk God asks us to take. ©LPi




Radio Maria

St. Bonaventure Feast Day - July 15th

Our patron saint, Saint Bonaventure was born in Bagnorea, a town in central Italy in the year 1221. His parents, Giovanni and Ritella, christened him Guivanni Fidanza Bonaventure. Seriously ill as a child, his mother entrusted him to St. Francis of Assisi and the child recovered. Inspired by Francis, he entered the Franciscan Order in 1238 and became a teacher of Theology at the University of Paris.

He was chosen as General of the Order in 1257. Bonaventure was God's instrument in bringing the order back to a greater love of the way of St. Francis through the book "The Life of St. Francis" that he wrote. In 1263, he presided over the Second General Chapter, marked by an intense movement of devotion to Our Lady. Pope Clement IV named him Archbishop of York in 1265. Pope Gregory, in 1273, made him Cardinal and Bishop of Albano. Worn out by his various activities, he fell ill and died on July 15, 1274. Bonaventure was canonized on July 14, 1482.

Bonaventure was a man of eloquence, and of outstanding holiness; he was known for his kindness, approachableness, gentleness and compassion. His emblem is a cardinal's hat.
