The Resurrection OF THE LORD

This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.

(Ps 118)

There is no day to compare with Easter Day. It stands out from the conflicts and turmoil of our world, lifts our minds and enlivens our hearts with joy and love so complete that it conquers death. Early on the first Easter morning a mighty act of God took place - Christ rose from the dead, altered the past and shaped the future. Nothing can be the same again. That is what makes Easter the greatest occasion of the year and Good News for all time. All our hopes and happiness stem from that event. Easter announces that there is a way forward out of darkness, transformation is possible and change can take place in our lives.

The resurrection of Jesus from the dead affirms that death is not the end of us. We are meant for more than this present life and are not anchored to this world. Human life is no longer limited by the cycle of birth to death. Easter is the answer to all the tears that we shed at the graves of our loved ones because it reminds us that we have a future greater than we dare believe in, provided we open our hearts to the grace that Jesus won for us. Christ has shared the gift of his life with us and his resurrection from the dead points to the resurrection of all people.

Easter is the turning point inviting us to live in an entirely new way that goes beyond the limitations of this world. We are challenged to become part of a new creation, inspired by the life of God, which is poured into our souls at baptism. Life depends on how we look at it. It can be seen as an empty tomb, full of bitterness and confusion or full of joy and hope. The challenge is to appreciate God to see his plan in the ordinary events surrounding us. We can only do this if we are faithful to our baptismal promises, tuned into Jesus and switched on to his power in our lives. He will help us to find the face of God in the bits and pieces of life and in the hearts of all whom we meet.

The gospel tell us that on the first Easter morning the stone at the entrance of the tomb of Christ was rolled back. The question we must all face is: have we arisen to new life with Christ, or are there boulders weighing us down and keeping us imprisoned in our tombs? The Good News is that by God's power the boulders that hold you and me locked and buried can be rolled back and we can be set free. God is in charge. It is his world and he has breathed eternity into our bones. The best way we can give thanks to God for the gift of his life within us this Easter, is by opening our hearts to the risen Jesus and by allowing ourselves to be sent out into the world to proclaim the Good News of Christ's love.

Our hearts are filled with joy on this Easter Day. With renewed confidence we bring our needs before God the Father in prayer.



Why His Resurrection Matters



First, why does Jesus' death matter to us? St. Paul wrote in Galatians 2:19: "I have been crucified with Christ." He was very much alive, so what did he mean?

Our sins are in us. They cause us to die. But we are IN Christ by faith. He took us with him to the grave, with our death (and his) being the consequences of sin. Second Corinthians 5:21: "For our sake he made him to be sin who did not know sin, so that we might become the righteousness of God in him."

Christ's sinlessness is ours now. He gave his righteousness to us. Did God the Father accept Christ's gift to us? The resurrection is the evidence that God was satisfied with Christ's sacrifice. He gave his son's life back and his glory. When he arose, we rose with him. He wouldn't let us go on for eternity without sharing it with the One we owe it all to.

But there still remains an outcome of his resurrection. Our bodies will be raised just as his was and will be glorified. We know he has the power raise us. He raised Lazarus and brought others who had died back to life. So, we don't fear death.

First Corinthians 15:54-55: "When this which is corruptible clothes itself with incorruptibility and this which is mortal clothes itself with immortality, then the word that is written shall come about: Death is swallowed up in victory. O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?



A Golden Treatise of Mental Prayer, Meditation, and Devotion by St. Peter of Alcantara

The Golden Treatise is an admirably concise introduction to contemplative prayer. Part One teaches reading, meditation, and prayer, while Part Two offers additional instructions on devotion. This volume is prefaced by a brief life of the Franciscan saint by the translator, drawing on the writings of St. Teresa of Avila, whose work he had encouraged and supported. After studying at the University of Salamanca, Peter of Alcantara joined the Franciscans of the Stricter Observance. He was ordained priest and began preaching to the poor with much success. After two years of solitary retreat, he journeyed barefoot to Rome and obtained permission of Pope Julius III to found poor convents in Spain. In confirmation of his virtues and mission of reformation. God worked numerous miracles through his intercession and by his very presence. He was beatified by Pope Gregory XV in 1622 and canonized by Pope Clement IX in 1669. Dewey 230.6
