### Pentecost Sunday June 5, 2022

And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim.

(Acts 2:4)

### Receive the Holy Spirit. (John 20:22)

On this day of celebration, we are brought back to the upper room to be with the disciples when they first met the risen Lord. John tells us that when Jesus came to them, he showed them his hands and side. There was something about seeing Jesus' wounds-now glorified-that thrilled their hearts.

We don't have to look too hard to identify the work of the Holy Spirit here. It was the Spirit who showed the disciples that Jesus didn't just come back from the dead but that he had actually defeated death and had been declared Lord of heaven and earth. By the Spirit, they realized that because of Jesus' wounds they too could be filled with divine life, just as their Master was. And this revelation filled them with excitement.

Brothers and sisters, the Holy Spirit wants to give all of us the same revelation. After all, this is what Pentecost is all about-seeing Jesus in a whole new way. Whenever we pray, whenever we go to Mass, the Spirit wants to reveal Jesus to our hearts-his love, his mercy, and his power. He wants to break down the walls that keep us trapped in a narrow, shallow understanding of God's plan. He wants to do this so that he can form us into a people on fire with love for him, willing to surrender our lives to him, and eager to bring his good news to a wounded world.

We don't have to fear the Holy Spirit. He may come in fire, but only to burn away the things that keep us from Jesus. We can carry so much "baggage" in our hearts-fears, anxieties, and resentments. But by the power of the cross, the Holy Spirit wants to lighten our load so that we can embrace Jesus as our just and loving Savior who wants the very best for us.

"Jesus, I want to rejoice in you just as the apostles did.

Come, Spirit, and give me a new revelation of Jesus."

### Do You Want to be Well?



John 5:2-9 describes a supposed supernatural phenomenon. When the water of a particular pool began stirring or bubbling, the first infirm person who entered the water was healed. A man was there who had been debilitated for thirty-eight years.

When Jesus saw him lying there and knew that he had been ill for a long time, he said to him, <u>"Do you want to be well?</u>

On the face of it, Jesus's question seems unnecessary. Why wouldn't he want to get well after 38 years of misery? But, his question probes into the man's motivation. His debility may have become his identity. Others were providing for his basic needs. Did he really want the responsibility of caring for himself? Perhaps he thought, 'I'm just a cripple. I'll never be anything else.'

Each of us has debilities. Like this man, we may tell ourselves and others that things will never improve. The sick man answered Jesus, "Sir, <u>I have no one to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; while I am on my way, someone else gets down there before me."</u>

We might be emotionally crippled. We may blame others for our situation. We may have brought disaster on ourselves for bad financial decisions. Jesus asks us the same question: "Do you want to be well? If we do, his instruction is the same: "Rise...and walk." The man obeyed and was healed. Suppose he had replied, 'I can't get up?' He would have remained in his misery.

The time for him to be dependent on others was over. He <u>wanted to be well</u> and did as Jesus instructed him. Whatever our debility, it's between us and God. He let it happen for a reason – for us to take responsibility for our situation and learn that he is our provider. In verse 14, Jesus encounters the man again and tells him, "Look, you are well; do not sin anymore, so that nothing worse may happen to you." He was liable, at least partly, as we all are. When we want to get well, let's acknowledge our sins and forsake them. Then we can rise up and keep walking in our own strength. Peace be with you!

### GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Even though Pentecost is rightly celebrated in late spring, the robust experience of a New England fall can provide a profound metaphor for reflection. A full expression of fall colors is beautiful to behold. But, with all of its majesty and beauty, the observer knows the experience of death is soon to come. Creation will be dark and barren for a while. Pentecost cannot be separated from the cross. Before God's transformative, life-giving power can bear fruit, we must first die.

Pentecost is all about leaving the lifeless dead wood behind and allowing God, through the power of the Holy Spirit, to create something new. These Pentecost creations happen repeatedly over and over again. The birthing process of the Church is ongoing. God is always bringing life out of death and creating something where there was once nothing. That is why the fall is such an apropos metaphorical season for Pentecost. In order to really receive the gift of the Holy Spirit we have to die to what we once knew and what no longer works.

When fire and wind find their fullest expression, they are in no way gentle nor kind. They have the potential to level anything in their paths. We are experiencing great turmoil in our world, nation, and our Church. Whether the result of circumstance or the work of the Holy Spirit, much of what we knew to be normal and constant is changing. Common systems and institutional structures that may have worked for a time no longer do. When the old and familiar need to be left behind, God creates something new. Change and disorder do not need to be our enemies. They always bring opportunities for something exciting and new. What we need is untiring faith, firm hope, and perfect love.

What we need is for the Holy Spirit to enlighten us to see what is important and what we must do. "O Holy Spirit, descend plentifully into my heart. Enlighten the dark corners of this neglected dwelling and scatter there Thy cheerful beams." (St. Augustine) If we experience joy, even in the midst of turbulence, then we will know we are exactly where God needs us to be. If not, then perhaps there is a lesson in the decaying leaves that graciously descend to the ground on a crisp fall day. ©LPi






