As they were proceeding on their journey someone said to him, "I will follow you wherever you go."

(LR 9:57)

The call and the cost of Christian commitment are heavily emphasized in this gospel where the life of discipleship and its qualities are laid out before us. There is nothing about being a follower of Jesus that does not demand effort. As all existing responsibilities have to take second place, discipleship is not something to be entered into casually. On his journey to Jerusalem, Jesus meets three men who are anxious to follow him but who are unfit and unprepared for the challenge involved. The young man bursting with enthusiasm who, with whole-hearted response, vowed to be a follower whenever he would go, must have been surprised to hear Jesus dampen his spirits and warn him off with the caution, that the Son of Man did not have a home to call his own. Jesus is only being fair when he makes it clear in very direct speech what is expected of those who wish to join his group. If we want to accompany him we must know what we are doing and be aware of the harsh realities of life. To follow Jesus to Calvary can be no casual accompaniment of a wandering preacher. The message is harsh but clear if anything at all stands in our way or takes priority over Jesus in our lives, then we are not free to follow him.

Every day we are faced with a situation similar to these three young volunteers. In the midst o f our work, as we are hurrying about our business, we encounter Jesus who beckons us to come and serve. He longs for us to acknowledge his loving presence in silently carrying out his will. It's an on-going challenge requiring practical daily choices which are not always easy to make. Sometimes it may involve a serious conflict of loyalty or it may be a simple call to be friendly or neighborly. Our journeying with Christ at baptism with the promise to make his way of life our own. Growing in closeness to him is the result of making daily sacrifices, but the grind of monotonous living gets to us all and is evident in our half-hearted responses.

We love the call but we quibble about the cost to our personal freedom. Sunday Mass affords us a wonderful opportunity to deepen a renew the relationship which we have established with Christ as a believing community. It's a time to pray for the grace to follow him whole heartedly without wavering or reservation. The Lord's call requires an immediate response and is not just something to be fitted in after we have attended to all the important business; like maintaining our status, our popularity and all the other goals we set ourselves. Whatever invitation comes our way, our reply should always be: 'You are my God. It is you who are my portion'.

We place our needs before God our Father whose Son has gone before us and has called us to follow him. With confidence we pray for the grace to accept that calling.

#### **Gospel Meditation**

And to another he said, "Follow me." In every moment of every day, in every circumstance and experience, God is calling us. We can easily get distracted and not hear it or simply ignore it, pretending it wasn't even heard. When we do hear it and favorably respond, there are some conditions that must be met. Jesus makes it clear that once we say yes to his invitation, we must stay focused and forge ahead. We cannot keep looking behind or worry about unfinished business. There are some tasks, and discipleship is one, that require our full devotion.

There are many "masters" vying for our attention. We need something or someone to give us direction. Human nature requires it. Our motives and actions reveal what has our allegiance. It is tempting to give ourselves to masters that lure us with intriguing promises. When given the choice between a "master" that promises worldly success, abundant wealth, status, privilege, and security versus a "master" that asks for selfsacrifice, hardship, suffering, ridicule, and death, to whom do we go? While the promise of immediate pleasure is enticing, there is always a catch. For all that secular masters can promise. they always keep us looking behind, checking on ourselves, second guessing choices, calculating options, and being slaves to excessive worry. Our guard can never come down. Only one master really promises life: Jesus Christ. Hearing his call, we either trust him or we don't.

Saying yes to following Christ does come with a risk. But it also comes with the brightness of future hopes and dreams. There is no need to keep looking behind. Sins are forgiven and regrets serve no effective purpose. God is not there. He's moved beyond all that stuff. God is in the today and the tomorrow and what he can continually do with our daily affirmation to follow Him. All we need to do is be obedient. St. Gianna Molla is credited with saying, "The stillness of praver is the most essential condition for fruitful action. Before all else, the disciple kneels down." Begin with prayer. We will not only hear God's call but find the courage to trust that He will guide us where we need to be. God uses us in the most ordinary of ways through the simple daily expression of our lives. ©LPi



#### The Bible and Me?



Who has the final word when two parties disagree on matters

of faith and practice? If you or I were to answer that question, would we say, 'God has the final word'? And if that is

our answer, how would we find out what God says on a matter of faith and practice? Well, he has already spoken. His words are available for all to read.

'All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for refutation, for correction, and for training in righteousness,

so that one who belongs to God may be competent, equipped for every good work.' (2 Timothy 3:16-17) Wow! We can be equipped for every good work by knowing the scriptures.

On that question of the Bible and me, do I have a Bible? Do I study it? Should I study it? How about this – Does Jesus want me to study it and live by it? What does he say in Mathew 4:4? 'One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of God.' Every word? Wow! It's a very thick book. Is that even possible?

The longest Bible chapter is Psalm 119. It has 176 verses. What do all of those verses speak about? <u>The Word of God.</u> For example, verse 9: 'How can the young keep his way without fault? Only by observing <u>your words</u>.' Or verse 72: 'The <u>law of your</u> <u>mouth</u> is more precious to me than heaps of silver and gold.' In a Christian's walk, there's no replacement.

A scribe asked Jesus what is the greatest commandment. He answered, 'You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments.

It's a thick book but loving God and our neighbor *deeply* fulfills the top two requirements. Studying his Word helps us do both.
