
From the
Journal of Fr. Jared

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

One topic that many Catholics misunderstand is cremation. Prior to 1963, the Church forbade cremation, partly because the Roman empire would burn the bodies of Christian martyrs to preclude their one day rising from the grave. The Church first allowed cremations in 1963, as long as it was not intended as a rejection of the power of resurrection. In 1969, the Church allowed for the committal of cremated remains, but not their presence at a funeral liturgy, which was not allowed until 1997. While the Church allows cremation, it prefers burial of the bodies of the deceased. Cremation is prohibited when it was chosen for reasons contrary to Christian doctrine. The sprinkling of ashes, the division of ashes among family members, the conversion of ashes into jewelry, infused within the core of a plant, and/or the placement of a family member or friend in a place in the honor are strictly forbidden.

When people choose to be cremated, their mortal remains are expected to be placed in a cemetery or columbarium. A columbarium is like a mausoleum meant for the cremated remains or the cremains of people. Many people opt for cremation today because it is less expensive than the traditional casket burial with the preparation of the body. While our parish cemetery has two small sections dedicated to inground burials of cremains, it does not currently have a columbarium. There are several American companies that make ones that are lasting and don't break the bank. I am still trying to assess the need for a columbarium for our parish cemetery. A small number of individuals have come forward to express their desire for a columbarium. If you are interested in St. Monica acquiring a columbarium, let me know directly whether in person, by email, or by phone call.
