
Journal of When we speak of the Institution Narrative & Consecration, we need to discuss the idea of real presence. Jesus becomes really

present in many ways during the Mass. First, He becomes present in the assembly, where two or three are gathered in His name. He is always present in His Word when it is read or proclaimed.

The Church uses the term "real presence" to point to the fact that Eucharist is not merely a symbol or a remembrance of what Jesus has done. Jesus becomes really present during the Eucharistic Prayer, and His presence remains as long as the Eucharist remains.

The term that is typically connected to the Eucharist is transubstantiation, meaning a change of substance. The unconsecrated host and altar wine with the words of Jesus echoed through the priest do not change the physical appearance of the Eucharist, which would be more aptly called transformation or transfiguration, a change in form. Instead, the substance/essence of the Eucharist becomes the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ, while retaining the appearance of unleavened bread and altar wine.


The term "transubstantiation" is connected to St. Thomas Aguinas, but the teaching of real presence has persisted since the beginnings of the Church. The presence of Jesus remains after the change of substance. It does not return to its previous state, which is why the Precious Blood is consumed, and the Body of Jesus is kept in the Tabernacle for further adoration. While our senses cannot grasp the change, the change happens regardless. Many, who broke off from the Church, would make fun of the Church's teaching by twisting the Latin of the priest in consecration, "HOC EST ENIM CORPUS MEUM" to hocus pocus, reducing it to a magic spell.
