


From the Journal of Fr. Jared

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

In the Vatican's Instruction on Certain Questions Regarding the Collaboration of the Non-Ordained Faithful in the Sacred Ministry of

Priests promulgated on August 15, 1997, we read:

In eucharistic celebrations deacons and non-ordained members of the faithful may not pronounce prayers—e.g. especially the eucharistic prayer, with its concluding doxology—or any other parts of the liturgy reserved to the celebrant priest. Neither may deacons or non-ordained members of the faithful use gestures or actions which are proper to the same priest celebrant. It is a grave abuse for any member of the non-ordained faithful to "quasi preside" at the Mass while leaving only that minimal participation to the priest which is necessary to secure validity. (ICP Practical Provisions 6 §2)

What does this mean? You are not meant to mouth the words the priest says when praying on your behalf or replicate his actions. For example, think about how many mirror the priest in extending their hands when the priest extends his and says, "The Lord be with you." During the Mass, the Priest typically extends his hands 28 times. This position of extended hands is known as the "orans" position or praying position. This ancient gesture of prayer is exclusively reserved to the priest when they are praying for and in the name of the people of God. During the Our Father, the faithful are not to use the orans position, not even the deacon can use it.

In the older tradition of the Mass, the Our Father was said exclusively by the priest on behalf of the people. Now the people join the priest in praying the Our Father, but they are invited to keep their hands folded or at their side. The extended hand position by the lay people started with the mindset that all the people of God are equal, which is true in dignity but not in role. It also became a protest in some places, like people calling the priest by their first name without their title.

I also want to address the position of holding hands during the Our Father. It is widespread in many parishes, yet the Church has never taught this. Some would argue that holding hands conveys the family style union of the Church, but our reciting or singing the prayer in unison already expresses this. It is also awkward for those who don't want an acquaintance or stranger holding their hand. This practice can drag this prayer of adoration and petition that is vertical and addressed to God to something solely human and horizontal, just about the community. The best argument for not holding hands is that the holding of hands anticipates and then duplicates the sign of peace offered a few moments later. This action of private prayer is being brought in a communal prayer in a way it is not meant to be.

When I think of Jesus ascending into heaven, I often think of this painting that my good friend, Miss Pat, created before a stroke severely restricted her ability to move. She told me that she had been inspired by God to paint it.

Even though her life had been dramatically changed by her stroke, her love for Jesus remained steady and sure. Over the years, as I visited her at the nursing home, I was amazed that despite her pain and limitations, she was always full of joy. She had a sign in her room next to her painting of Jesus that quoted Philippians 4:13 – "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." And with absolute faith in Him, she did.

Miss Pat was often seated in her wheelchair near the nurse's station, where those who needed a little extra attention could be found. Even though she had great difficulty moving, she was like a guardian angel to those sitting around her. She comforted those who would cry because they missed their families. If someone was anxious or agitated, she would soothe them as if they were a child, using only her voice. When she saw someone was in trouble, she would call a nurse to get them help quickly. And she would always tell everyone about Jesus.

Time has passed since then and Miss Pat is with Jesus now. She was an inspiration to me. I hope her story somehow inspires you, too.




Do You Have an Artificial Christmas Tree That You Would Like to Donate or Let Us Borrow for VBS?


