


From the Journal of Fr. Jared

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

As we go up to receive communion, we are reminded that Jesus is the Bridegroom and we are the Bride, processing up to meet Him. When we

approach the minister of communion, all are expected to make a gesture of reverence; a body bow is typically recommended if you are stable on your feet. After the minister says either, "The Body of Christ" or "The Blood of Christ", the person receiving communion says, "Amen" clearly and audibly unless they are mute. The response is never, "Thank you" or another expression.

There are two acceptable ways to receive Jesus: 1. in your *overlapping* hands, making a flat throne for Jesus (your hands should look like a crossed x) or 2. in your mouth, *tongue fully extended and mouth as open as possible*. If you receive in your hands, then they should be stationary; your hands also should not be side by side, this allows for the Eucharist to drop to the floor. If you only have one hand available, whether because of a cane or



baby, then the preference would be for you to receive on the tongue. If you receive communion on the tongue, then the minister should be able to place Jesus on your tongue without their fingers touching the sides of your mouth. If you receive in the hand, then your hands should overlap, not just a hand underneath your wrist, as I have seen.

Preferably, you should consume the Eucharist without delay. Under no circumstances should you take the consecrated host and dunk it in the Precious Blood. This action called intinction is typically reserved for priests under special circumstances and part of rituals connected to non-Latin Rite churches. It is not the norm in most of the United States. I would also invite you to refrain from having anything in your hands, if you are going to receive in your hands.

If a child does not seem old enough to receive communion, then they or their accompanying family members could be asked if they have received their first holy communion. If a person comes up not knowing how to receive, then in my experience, typically they are not Catholic, and they will be given a blessing. (If you wish to receive a blessing instead of communion, then come up with your arms folded across your chest. The prayer of blessing will typically be said silently.)

Lastly, many do the Sign of the Cross after receiving communion; this is a family practice that has crept into Mass and not taught in the Universal Church. I would discourage it for three reasons: 1. Why are we calling upon the Trinity as we are receiving the Son? 2. Particles from our fingers could fall on the floor, and 3. We are adding something the Church hasn't asked us to do. We do not just do things in liturgy because they are nice.


Dear Parishioners of Saint Monica's Parish,


