From the Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

**Fr. Jared** As I am now juggling my time between St. Monica and St. John the Evangelist in Interlachen, know that my heart as a shepherd remains with you. While I am managing to celebrate Masses and hear confessions on weekdays, well enough, I cannot currently handle the current weekend Mass schedule on my own. For the next few months, we will be hosting a variety of priests between the two parishes to cover the weekend Mass times until full-time help will be available. For now, the 4:30 p.m. and 11 a.m. Mass times will stay the same at St. Monica.

However, I must ask one temporary change - for the 8:30 a.m. Mass to be shifted to 8 a.m. for the next few months, so I can cover both parishes on Sunday. I know that this is not ideal, but if I don't make this shift, covering Masses at both places will be logistically impossible since the two churches are 25 minutes apart from each other. CCF, Youth Group, and OCIA would stay at the same times, in recognition that this time change is temporary. **This change will take effect the weekend of 7/19-20; that is next weekend.** 

I also ask you to be patient with me, recognizing that I will not have the same freedom of schedule as I would in the past for appointments. I will also not necessarily have the time to greet you after Mass like I typically do. Please pray for St. John the Evangelist and me in this time of transition and know of my constant prayers for you.

If you have a good prayer routine, you might find it challenging to stick to it in the summer because your normal schedule isn't in place. If you find this to be true, don't let it frustrate you. Look at it as a good opportunity to change things up a little. It might even give your prayer life a refreshing boost.

The most important thing to remember is God should be the first one you think about when you wake up and last one you think about before you go to bed. When you first wake up, thank Him for another day of living and loving in this world. Ask Him, "What are we going to do today?" And before you put your head on your pillow at night, think back on your day. Thank God for all He did for you. Are there any things that you might have done differently? Make a plan with God for tomorrow.

And while you are going about your day, take time to smell the roses. Look around you at the beauty of God's creation. See if there are opportunities to help others. Offer each thing you do up to God as a sacrifice. That way your whole day becomes a prayer to God!
