



This year, we commemorate a monumental milestone in the life of the Church: the 1700<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the First Council of Nicaea, convoked by

Emperor Constantine in the city of Nicaea, which is now Iznik, Turkey. This extraordinary gathering was a defining moment in all of Christian history, as bishops from across the Roman Empire assembled to affirm the foundational truths of our faith.

The Council of Nicaea was convened in reaction to growing theological disputes, particularly the nature of Christ. At the heart of the controversy was the teaching of Arius, who claimed that Jesus Christ was not fully divine. In defense of the apostolic faith, the council declared that the Son is "of the same substance" (*homoousios*) with the Father—fully God and fully man.

Out of this profound theological clarity came the original form of what we now call the Nicene Creed. This profession of faith has been recited by Christians across the centuries and around the globe, uniting us in the essential beliefs of the Gospel. When we proclaim the Nicene Creed at Mass or in prayer, we echo the voices of those early Church Fathers who courageously stood for the truth of Christ's divinity.

As we reflect on 1700 years since Nicaea, we are reminded that the truths of our faith are not only historical, but living and active. The Creed is not a relic of the past—it is a living testimony to the Triune God we worship and serve. It continues to shape our understanding, anchor our beliefs, and unite us across cultures and centuries.

In recognition of all that this prayer means to us and its essential nature in the Mass, I will be offering my next adult education class, titled *Navigating the Nicene Creed*. It will be offered on Tuesdays at 11:15 a.m. in light of my responsibilities at St. John the Evangelist and on Thursdays at 6:45 p.m.

# Grow Strong in Your Faith With Karen Lee


"Only God knows the good that can come about by reading one good Catholic book." - St. John Bosco

If we care about what we feed our bodies, shouldn't we also care about what we feed our souls? One thing that we can do to give our souls a boost is spiritual reading. Maybe we should turn off our TVs for a while, set down our phones, and put our video games on pause. After all, heaven is on our horizon. Shouldn't we be spending more time getting to know our God better?

So, what if reading isn't your thing? Why not try reading just a little bit every day? Try The Word Among Us that is available monthly for free at the entrances of our church. Or you can subscribe without charge to daily online email devotions that arrive promptly in your inbox each morning. They give you a short daily scripture reading and an inspiring reflection. Fifteen minutes max! Just search the Dynamic Catholic or the Morning Offering websites to sign up. If you find yourself wanting more, try to find a spiritual book that interests you and commit to reading a chapter a day. Keep a highlighter or a pencil nearby to mark things that you might want to go back to later.

And for those of you who love to read books, try reading one spiritual book for every romance, murder mystery, or non-fiction book you read. Or read both if you like! We have a sampling of books in the Parish Book Nook at the entrance of our church that change each week or so. You are welcome to take one at any time. No need to sign them out. You can keep them as long as needed and then return them when you are done. If you don't see anything there that appeals to you, you can also browse our entire library in the church hall. There is something there for everyone. The library is open during coffee and donuts time on Sundays until CCF classes begin and during office hours on weekdays. (If you have spiritual books of your own at home that you would like to donate and share with others, they will be appreciated.)

Before you know it, you'll find that the more you read about God, the more you will want to know!

# **Healing the Pain of Abortion**


