

LITURGICAL NOTES

"Unto you have I lifted up my soul." These are the very first words the Church gives us for the holy season of Advent in the Entrance Antiphon. It is a gesture of both contrition and confidence. Psalm 25, from which this prayer comes, acknowledges our sinfulness before God and trust in His merciful response to the waywardness of His creatures. It is such an important message that we hear it a second time in the Offertory Antiphon! The Communion Antiphon is the beautiful, sighing response of joy in realizing that God will deal mercifully with us. "The Lord will bestow his loving kindness, and our land will yield its fruit." Barrenness gives way to fruitfulness. Filthiness becomes clean once more. Brokenness is made whole again. Let us renew our "sense of sin" this season and beg God that He "not allow my enemies [the powers of Hell] to laugh at me" lest we fall into the trap of loving what is evil and hating what is good, finding ourselves unready for that unknown time "when the Lord of the house is coming." Miserere nobis!

FROM THE PASTOR





TIME TO EMBRACE THE LIGHT FROM THE MESSIAH
First Sunday of Advent 2020

"Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." John 8:12

The Advent season is a journey through the biblical story that shows us how all the promises of God find their fulfilment in Jesus Christ. Advent points us to Jesus, the fulfillment of the Messianic era, the Kingdom of God. At his first coming, which we celebrate at Christmas, Jesus showed us his humility, his love for us, and his heart of grace toward sinners and those who suffer. At his second coming, which we look forward to in Advent, he will complete what he started at his birth; bringing a final end to suffering, sin, and death, restoring his creation, and setting up a new kingdom of righteousness and peace. "God keeps his promises" indeed.

For us living in this millennium, we settle into the fact that the Kingdom of God is within our midst. St. Paul to the Romans says this. "Christ lives within you, so even though your body will die because of sin, the Spirit gives you life because you have been made right with God" Romans 8:10. We the "born again" through water and Spirit, know that the Holy Spirit has come to take up residence in us. We have become His temple (2Corinthians 6:16-18). Right now, wherever you are, and whatever circumstances you find yourself in, know there is a

silent burner that needs to be ignited so the works of the Kingdom of God may be manifested. Unless we activate that which God has put within us, it will simply lie dormant within us and no one will get any of the benefits of its purposes. Advent provides us with such a great opportunity to ignite the Light of Faith we received and allows it to become visible and active in our actions.

"You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl, but on the lamp stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house."

Mark 5:14-15. What is Jesus trying to convey about us when he says we are the light of the world? Think about what light does. Light brings life to things that are dormant and helps them grow. It penetrates and transforms the darkness. Light makes visible what is already real but cannot be seen in the darkness. It reveals the true shape of things. The light of Christ can do that through us as well.

When Jesus went into a place, crowded with all different kinds of people, he could see what we too often see. Though he could have said, "Oh those kids are too confused. These people are too rich, those too poor; too Democrat or too Republican." In other words, Jesus could have seen people who were easy to ignore at best, or easy to criticize at worst. But instead, when his light shone on the crowds, he had nothing but compassion on them because he could see who they really were—harassed and helpless people, like sheep without a shepherd (Matthew 9:35-36).

What I see in the Scriptures, is when the light of Jesus fell on people, he did not size them up into different categories the way our culture molds us to do. <u>Jesus had two categories and two categories only</u>. He either saw someone who belongs to the family of His Father or someone who belonged to His Father's Family and has not found the way back! Could we do that? Could the light of Christ in us become so powerful that it melts away all our other categories and prejudices?
