My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Holy Gospel reminds us today that we do not always see things as the Lord sees them. The phrase "Jesus is Lord!" comes off the tongue easily enough, but have we stopped to examine the many implications of this exclamation, the truly radical nature of that claim? Have we stopped to consider all that the Lord has done for us?

Congratulations to all of our young people who are making their Confirmation this morning. We pray that God's Holy Spirit will accompany them throughout their lives and that they will be faithful witnesses to Christ.

Please remember to make your ADA pledge. We still owe \$46,141.00. Envelopes are obtainable at the doors of the Basilica. And please keep an eye on our giving versus our needs, a summary of which is in the bulletin each week. We are somewhat behind on what is needed to meet our expenses.

Unfortunately, last week at Holy Family School the outside statue of the Blessed Mother was destroyed, and a monument of the 10 Commandments was vandalized with spray paint. In order to protect our grounds, please be advised that the gate will be closed earlier in the evening from now on, as long as there are no cars in the parking lot. If you plan to be on the grounds after 8:00 p.m. please advise the office ahead of time.

The Parish Council will meet on the third Sunday of September. I will discuss with them the idea of returning to coffee and donuts on Sunday morning beginning September 27th. It will depend on a number of factors, including volunteers to prepare things, serve and clean up afterwards. We may have to look at a new procedure for all of this. We will put an announcement in the bulletin the week before we begin.

ANSWER: The sacraments are efficacious ex opere operato ("by the very fact that the sacramental action is performed") because it is Christ who acts in the sacraments and communicates the grace they signify. The efficacy of the sacraments does not depend upon the personal holiness of the minister. However, the fruits of the sacraments do depend on the dispositions of the one who receives them.

Derecho & Beirut Disaster Relief

Dear Friends in Christ,

On August 10, 2020, a straight-line windstorm, called a derecho, hit Iowa with hurricane-force winds. The storm caused severe damage to crops, businesses, and homes. Tens of thousands of individuals and families, more than a week afterwards, are still without power, assessing damages, and removing debris from their properties.

Six of the 23 counties within the Diocese of Des Moines are part of Governor Kim Reynold's Proclamation of Disaster Emergency including Audubon, Cass, Dallas, Guthrie, Madison, and Polk. Out of these six counties, Polk and Dallas counties have been declared Federal Disaster Areas. The recovery process it expected to be lengthy and costly.

The Diocese of Des Moines is working with our local Catholic Charities to help the individuals and families most severely affected by the derecho. A Derecho Relief Fund has been established for this work of mercy. If you are able to help, your donation will provide direct relief to those in most need. If our collective generosity meets the scope of need in the Diocese of Des Moines, we will be contacting neighboring dioceses with significant damage such as the Archdiocese of Dubuque and the Diocese of Davenport to share these relief funds. We are in the process of exploring a further collaboration with the three other dioceses in Iowa to provide statewide assistance to all the affected peoples and areas.

In addition to the foregoing, our Church mourns the terrible suffering of those impacted by the tragic explosion in Beirut, Lebanon that killed so many without warning in early August, 2020. 2,750 tons of ammonium nitrate detonated at the city's port resulting in the deaths of at least 160 people. Thousands of people remain injured or homeless and the scope of suffering has only begun to be grasped. We have been asked by the bishops of the United States to offer a response of prayer, fasting, almsgiving, and advocacy.
