LIFELINES: Being "pro-life' and defending life are not things "added on" to our faith, or optional, "extra-curricular" activities. On the contrary, the whole culmination of the liturgical year leads us to the days when Jesus, by dying, destroyed our death, and by rising, restored our life...Jesus endured the rigors of the passion... precisely because of how much he values human life. He did it for us. He did it because he wanted to raise human life to the heights of heaven. Through his Passion and resurrection, he does not only conquer his own death; he overturns the very kingdom of death. We cannot listen to or believe the Gospel of the Passion without marveling at how much God loves each human life,....Christ dies once for all, but Calvary continues today as innocent people are killed in abortion clinics nationwide. As John Paul II wrote, "It is precisely in the "flesh" of every person that Christ continues to reveal himself and to enter into fellowship with us, so that rejection of human life, in whatever form that rejection takes, is really a rejection of Christ" (The Gospel of Life, n.104). The Gospel of the Passion continues in our day...(Priests for Life, Fr.FrankPavone)
