So, we are already far ahead of most parishes in that regard. As a Basilica, we are called to imitate the Papal liturgy of Rome and are doing a fine job of it! I can assure you of that from my time in Rome under Pope St. John Paul the Great.

We have entered the beautiful Fall Season. Let us enjoy it before the cold and snow of winter sets in. God's blessing and peace be yours!

CATECHISM CORNER:

Last week's question: ***What is required of one who is to be baptized?***

ANSWER: Everyone who is to be baptized is required to make a profession of faith. This is done personally in the case of an adult or by the parents and by the Church in the case of infants. Also the godfather or the godmother and the whole ecclesial community share the responsibility of baptismal preparation (catechumenate) as well as for the development and safeguarding of the faith and grace given at baptism.

LIFELINES: (cont'd) Pro-lifers are criticized for being "fetus-lovers" who are insensitive to women. But one cannot, and pro-lifers do not, love the child without loving the mother. Abortion defenders claim they care for women, even as they admit they are killing their children. But one cannot love the woman without loving the child. Nor can one harm the child without harming the mother. The message must be clear that to be pro-life means to be pro-woman, and that the challenge the pro-life movement gives to society is, "Why cannot we love them both?" One reason why many who think abortion is wrong will not actively oppose it is that they think they have to make a choice between defending the rights of the baby or those of the mother, or that they have to consider the baby as more important than the mother. But the authentic pro-life message is a message of equality. At a time when we are preparing to welcome the newborn Christ, our challenge is to expand the circle of welcome, love, and protection to all those expectant mothers AND their babies waiting to be born. Fiscal Year July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021 Report

Income = \$1,024,000

Expenses and capital improvements were around \$900,000 including \$65,000 of improvements to front steps, tuckpointing, and new flooring for the sanctuary, all of which were fully paid for. Apart from the capital improvements, expenses were down from the previous year.

Income includes a \$56,842.50 Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan which was forgiven in the 2020-21 fiscal year.

Having online donation in place facilitated continued sacrificial giving when Mass was halted, accounting for 16% of the year's income.

The Christmas offering exceeded \$131,000.




