My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today is "Gaudete Sunday" or the Sunday to rejoice. We are very near the feast of the Lord's Birth. As we continue our Advent journey, we should be mindful of taking to heart the messages of change in our lives that are pointed out in the Sacred Scriptures. Let us throw away all that does not belong to the Lord, and rejoice in his grace, and fill ourselves with joy as we prepare for the great Christmas feast!

By order of His Excellency Bishop Joensen, the WEARING OF A MASK IS MANDATED FOR ALL CHURCHES IN THE DIOCESE OF DES MOINES FOR ALL FUNCTIONS WITHIN THE CHURCHES. This includes Mass and any other liturgical functions, as well as in the vestibule until you have exited the Basilica. This mandate is in place until at least 02 February 2021. ALL SOCIAL FUNCTIONS ARE ALSO TO BE CANCELLED UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE. Those with physical or psychological reasons are exempted from the mandate. Please heed the Bishop's wishes in this matter.

Holy Communion will be brought down to the hall at the appropriate time.

LIFELINES: In a statement, the Catholic Medical Association, the American Association of Pro-Life Obstetricians and Gynecologists, the American College of Pediatricians and the Christian Medical and Dental Associations said the vaccines from Pfizer and Moderna did not use cells from aborted babies in their production phases, the Catholic News Agency reports. Though “it is true that the animal-phase testing for these vaccines used abortion-derived fetal cells, commendably, it does not appear that production methods utilized such cells,” the pro-life groups said. Both vaccines could soon be available in the United States. The companies said they are waiting for final approval from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, but the vaccines already are in production. The pro-life medical groups said ethical alternatives to cells from aborted babies are available, such as umbilical cord tissue and adult stem cells, neither of which involve the destruction of human life. They said many viral vaccines that have been produced in recent years did not use “abortion-derived fetal cell lines for their production.” “These and other ethical approaches provide encouragement for the future, where no vaccine will violate the dignity of human life in their production,” they continued. They urged pharmaceutical companies to commit to the “assurances of safety, efficacy” and “uncompromised ethical development” of vaccines. For more information on this go to LifeNews.com. My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We are preparing for the great feast of Christmas in this holy season of Advent. I pray it will be a time of many graces and blessings for all of you.

Bishop Joesnen has issued guidelines for the Christmas Masses as we continue to fight the Covid Pandemic. First of all, our Christmas schedule will be the following:

Christmas Eve

4:00 p.m. (Church will open at 3:00 p.m.)

6:00 p.m.

Midnight (Church will open at 11:00 p.m.)

Christmas Day

10:30 a.m. (Church will open at 9:30 a.m.)

This year there will be no Children's Mass. A small gift will be on tables in the vestibule for the children. The music will be limited to the organ and one Cantor and there will be no choir concert before the Midnight Mass. You are asked to try and spread out evenly among the scheduled Masses, especially at the Saturday Masses. I know this will require some sacrifice, but the Bishop would prefer not to have the church overly packed. The Mulvihill Hall will be used for the overflow for all Christmas Masses. There will be a screen set up in the hall and Holy Communion will be brought down at the appropriate time.

The Bishop has mandated the use of masks in all the churches in the diocese. This is important for Christmas since there will be many different people in attendance from all over. Please take his instruction seriously, as well as using the hand sanitizer. Please do not try and sit in the pews that have been taped off. The other restrictions continue to be in place such as distancing, especially when coming up for Holy Communion, and coming up last if you wish to receive Holy Communion on the tongue.

Let us do all we can to keep ourselves, and others, safe. I wish you all a most blessed and joyous Advent and Christmas Season!






