## Facts for Faithful Kids

1. **September 13** is the feast of St. John Chrysostom. However, Chrysostom was not his last name – it was a nickname. Chrysostom means GOLDEN-MOUTHED. St. John gave wonderful homilies at Mass and people came from long distances to hear him preach. Do you think God has a nickname for you?
2. The Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows is **September 15**. When Mary and Joseph brought the baby Jesus to the Temple, Simeon predicted that she would suffer sadness because of Jesus. He described them as seven swords piercing her heart. At the Crucifixion, Mary was very sad. But she knew that God had a special plan.
3. **September 16** is Mayflower Day. The Mayflower was a ship that set sail from England on September 16, 1620 bound for a new colony in Virginia. However, stormy weather and problems with navigation took the ship off course and the Mayflower dropped anchor off the coast of what is now Massachusetts on November 21! The people on board (called colonists) wrote an agreement called the Mayflower Compact that helped to rule the new colony that they called Plymouth. A year later, in gratitude for God's blessings, the colonists invited the Native Americans for the first Thanksgiving feast.
4. **September 17** is Constitution Day also known as Citizenship Day. This is a celebration of the birthday of our country. On this day in 1787, thirty-nine brave men signed a document that started the United States and put down in writing, the freedoms we enjoy today. Here is the beginning of this important document. We the people of the United States, in order to form a more perfect union, establish justice, insure domestic tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general welfare, and secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America. Later, Congress added the Bill of Rights.
