

This week we celebrate the **25th Sunday in Ordinary Time**. In the Gospel, Jesus was telling the disciples that it was going to be necessary for Him to die but that He would rise from the dead. However, the disciples were arguing over which of them was the most important. When Jesus asked them what the discussion was about they were ashamed because it was a fooling conversation. Jesus reminded them that we are not supposed to make ourselves important. Instead, we must see ourselves as the servant of others.

Catholics on Vacation

This week we explore the great state of Nebraksa. The resource is *Monuments, Marvels, and Miracles A Traveler's Guide to Catholic America* by Marion Amberg.

If you exit I-80 near Gretna, you will see a nighttime illuminated chapel. *Holy Family Shrine* was built in a prairie style. The shrine has a tomblike visitor's entrance, forty-five foot tall exterior wooden trusses that resemble wheat surrounding glass windows and a stream that both leads to and flows within the chapel beside the pews. The water culminates in a pool beneath the altar.

"He is Risen" shouts the **Cathedral of the Risen Christ** in Lincoln. Designed in the Ecclesiastical Modern church style, the church boasts sixty-nine stained glass windows including the stories-tall Crystal Screen depicting the Redemption events. In the sanctuary is a fourteen foot cross with the corpus of a Resurrected Christ.

Ecumenism was important on the prairie. In 1908, Keystone was a town too small for multiple churches so the Catholics and Protestants built one together. Called *The Little Church*, there is an altar at each end with benches having reversible backs in between. These pews allow the churchgoers to face the altar of their religion. Facts for Faithful Kids

- **1. September 21** is the feast of St. Matthew, the tax collector. At the time of Jesus, many Jews did not like the tax collectors because they were working for the Roman government. Often, the tax collector would overcharge the people. However, Jesus wanted everyone to know that they are loved by God, even tax collectors. Matthew was called to be one of the Twelve Apostles.
- **2. September 22** is the autumnal equinox. The equinox occurs twice in the year. The earth is not tilted toward or away from the sun but is directly above the Equator. At the Equator the night and day are of equal length. After the autumnal equinox we have moved into the season of Fall. Do you enjoy watching the leaves turn colors or rake them into piles and jump into them? Why not say a prayer of thanks for this wonderful new season?
- **3.** Have you ever needed someone else to help you settle an argument? On **September 24, 1789** Congress passed the Judiciary Act which set up the Supreme Court of the United States. Article 3 of the Constitution established a Court to determine whether laws followed the Constitution. The first court had 6 Justices, all men. The first woman to join the court was Sandra Day O'Connor who was appointed by President Ronald Reagan in 1981. Always remember that Jesus wants us to judge all things fairly.
