This week we celebrate the **26th Sunday in Ordinary Time**. In the Gospel, the apostles come to Jesus and report that someone who is not one of the Apostles is healing in the name of Jesus. They want Jesus to stop the man. Jesus tells the apostles not to worry because it is God who is healing the sick. Like Moses, Jesus is not trying to limit the number of people who spread God's message. Moses and Jesus wanted everyone to become God's prophet and to tell others about the Kingdom of God.

Catholics on Vacation

This is our final vacation state for 2021. We have circled the west and are returning home to celebrate the next few months at our home parishes. We will resume traveling in May. This week we explore the great state of Iowa. The resource is **Monuments, Marvels, and Miracles A Traveler's Guide to Catholic America** by Marion Amberg.

The **Grotto of the Redemption** in West Bend is nicknamed the eighth wonder of the world and has been featured in print and online. Nine stone grottos covering a city block tell the Redemption story beginning in Eden and culminating in the Crucifixion. Fr. Paul Dobberstein became deathly ill two weeks before ordination and vowed to build a grotto shrine in her honor if he was given health. Petrified wood, malachite, azurite, agates, geodes, jasper, quartz, topaz, calcite, stalactites and stalagmites are a partial list of the rocks comprising the grotto. westbendgrotto.com

In 1979, Pope John Paul II visited **Living History Farms** near Urbandale. Today, the **Church of the Land** stands on the Living History Farms spot where the altar had been and the Pope spoke about land stewardship and feeding the world's hungry. Over 350,000 people attended the event. A stained glass window depicting a cross with four seasonal fields replicates the banner that hung on the papal platform.

Spirituality

On September 27th, we celebrate the feast of St. Vincent de Paul, the patron saint of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. Vincent was a priest during the 17th Century renowned for his compassion, humility, and generosity and is known as the "Great Apostle of Charity." His teachings about God's special presence in the poor are revolutionary even in our day. The St. Vincent de Paul Society was established in Paris, in 1833, as an organization of faith by young men who wanted to live their faith more fully. The St. Vincent de Paul Society has been present in the United States for over 175 years. The Society is represented in the Milwaukee Archdiocese by over 120 conferences throughout our Catholic parishes.

Essential to the foundation of a conference is a focus on the elements of Spirituality, Friendship and Service. Journeying together towards holiness is central to the calling of a Vincentian (member of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul). They dedicate time to showing Christ's love to people experiencing poverty, suffering, and need. They gain the inspiration to do so through their shared spirituality along with a life of prayer and reflection on the Holy Scriptures, devotion to the Eucharist and by seeking the protection of the Virgin Mary.

Today begins our month-long Awareness series to inspire you to learn more about the Society and how the loving presence of God is found in service to the poor. Vincentian members of our parish ask for your prayers to encourage them in their mission of following Christ through compassionate service to those in need.




