

Catholics on Vacation

This week we explore the great state of Oklahoma.
The resource is **Monuments, Marvels, and Miracles A Traveler's Guide to Catholic America** by Marion Amberg.

Immaculate Conception Catholic Church on the Osage Reservation features a 10x25 foot stained glass window. The window includes Father John Schoenmakers, SJ bringing the Faith to members of the Osage Nation. The tribe members depicted include Chief Bacon Rind and his wife, Julia, Chief Arthur Bonnicastle and Chief Saucy Calf. icccpawhuska.org

Originally named Sacred Heart, *Christ the King Catholic Church* in Tulsa is believed to be the first church dedicated using this name in 1927. Pope Pius IX instituted that feast in 1925. There is an art deco stained glass window depicting Old Testament kings and saint-kings offering their crowns to Jesus, the King of Kings. *christthekingcatholic.church*

Come to Oklahoma City and see the sculpture **And Jesus Wept**. Located on the grounds of **St. Joseph Old Cathedral** that is adjacent to the Oklahoma City National Memorial, the statue of Jesus faces away from the bombing site with one hand covering Christ's sorrowing face. **sjocokc.org**

Facts for Faithful Kids

- 1. Labor Day this year is celebrated on **September 6**. Each year it is held on the first Monday of September. On this day, we honor all men and women who work in the industries and businesses that keep our country strong. Many members of labor unions walk in parades to celebrate their commitment to their brotherhood. It is a good day to thank God for all those who work.
- **2.** Have you ever heard of our country called "Uncle Sam"? On **September 7, 1813** the United States adopted this nickname. The name came from Samuel Wilson who sold barrels of beef to the Army during the war of 1812. He stamped the letters "U.S." for United States but soldiers called the meat "Uncle Sam's." The newspapers picked up the story and the name became popular.
- **3.** The Church has celebrated Mary's birth since at least the sixth century. A September birth was chosen because the Eastern Church begins its Church year with September. The **September 8** date helped determine the date for the feast of the Immaculate Conception on December 8 (nine months earlier). Scripture gives us no information about the childhood of Mary but we know that she becomes the mother of our Savior, Jesus.

4. On September 11, 2001

terrorists attacked the World Trade Center in New York City. Many people died in the Twin Towers that fell. It has been twenty years and we still remember. Please pray for the souls of those who died including the firefighters and police who went to rescue others. Also, pray for their families.
